Scope of work:

Denver Urban Gardens will take multiple approaches to reaching K-12 audiences with garden and food education. The primary goal: To expand DUG’s reach to both secondary and early childhood audiences (approximately 450 3rd-5th graders). For high school, this means expanding plans for food justice coursework and internships (approximately 140 HS students). For ECE, DUG will add new programming that offers children and their families opportunities to garden at home and at school (approximately 300 pre-k to 2nd graders). For elementary audiences, DUG will continue to provide virtual programming options as well as cooking classes. All of these programs are in an effort to provide more than 1,000 children with food and education about gardening and healthy eating.
