

Tammy Mulligan is the Executive Director of Denver Urban Matters (DenUM). A native of Colorado, Tammy has more than twenty years of leadership experience in human services both in Denver and Baltimore. During her time at DenUM, Tammy has conducted program evaluation, narrowed the focus and delivery of services, increased inclusivity efforts and developed a leadership team. She has increased revenue by 120% including individual donor development, foundation funding and major program development.

Tammy is passionate about the eradication of poverty and has spent significant volunteer time on this issue.
