A BILL

For an ordinance submitting to a vote of the qualified and registered electors of the City and County of Denver at a special municipal election to be held on Tuesday, November 2, 2021, the question of whether the City shall be authorized to issue or incur general obligation debt for the purpose of financing and/or refinancing the cost of repairs and improvements to the Denver Facilities System; providing the form of the ballot question; providing for other details in connection therewith; and ratifying action previously taken.

(1) WHEREAS, the City and County of Denver (the "City"), is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing as a home-rule municipality under Article XX of the Constitution (the "Constitution") and laws of the State of Colorado and the City Charter (the "Charter"); and

(2) WHEREAS, the members of the City Council of the City (the "City Council") have been duly elected and qualified; and

(3) WHEREAS, Article X, Section 20 of the Constitution ("TABOR") requires voter approval for the creation of any debt, imposition of any new tax, tax rate increase, mill levy above that for the prior year, extension of an expiring tax, and for collecting, retaining and expending certain moneys above limits established by TABOR; and

(4) WHEREAS, Section 7.5.1 of the Charter provides that no general obligation bonds shall be issued until the question of issuing the bonds shall have been submitted to a vote of the qualified and registered electors of the City and a majority of those voting upon the question by ballot shall have voted in favor of issuing such bonds; and

(5) WHEREAS, the City Council, after consultation with the Mayor and other appropriate municipal officers, has determined that the question of whether the City shall be authorized to issue or incur general obligation debt, including bonds, notes, loan agreements or other multiple fiscal year financial obligations of the City for the purposes and in the manner set forth in this ordinance should be submitted to the qualified and registered electors of the City at the special municipal election called by this ordinance to be held on November 2, 2021 (the "Election"); and

(6) WHEREAS, TABOR also requires the City to submit ballot issues (as defined in TABOR) to the City's electors on limited election days before action can be taken on such ballot issues; and

1 (7) WHEREAS, November 2, 2021, is one of the election dates at which ballot issues may
2 be submitted to the City's qualified and registered electors pursuant to TABOR; and

3 (8) WHEREAS, the Denver Clerk and Recorder (the "Clerk") is conducting a coordinated
4 election pursuant to the Uniform Election Code of 1992, being articles 1 through 13 of title 1, C.R.S.
5 (the "Uniform Election Code") on November 2, 2021; and

6 (9) WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 8.2.1 of the Charter, Section 15-4 Denver Revised
7 Municipal Code, Section 1-1-102 of the Uniform Election Code, Section 31-10-102.7, C.R.S. of the
8 Municipal Election Code, and this ordinance, the City Council may elect to utilize the provisions of
9 the Uniform Election Code in order to participate in the coordinated election on November 2, 2021;
10 and

11 (10) WHEREAS, the City Council hereby determines that it is necessary to submit to the
12 qualified and registered electors of the City, at the coordinated election to be held on November 2,
13 2021, the question of creating an indebtedness in the amounts specified in Section 3 below and the
14 imposition of an ad valorem property tax for the payment of such indebtedness for the purpose of
15 funding certain facilities for the City and its residents and taxpayers (the "Denver Facilities System");
16 and

17 (11) WHEREAS, the City Council hereby determines that the Denver Facilities System
18 includes facilities owned and/or operated by the City for the benefit of its residents and taxpayers
19 including without limitation community centers, libraries, and cultural facilities; and

20 (12) WHEREAS, it is necessary to set forth certain procedures concerning the conduct of
21 the Election.

22 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF**
23 **DENVER:**

24 Section 1. All action heretofore taken (not inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance)
25 by the City and the officers thereof, directed towards the election, and the objects and purposes
26 herein stated is hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

27 Section 2. Unless otherwise defined herein, all terms used herein shall have the
28 meanings defined in the Uniform Election Code.

29 Section 3. Pursuant to Section 8.2.3 of the Charter, the City Council hereby determines to
30 call a special election to be conducted pursuant to the Uniform Election Code as part of the
31 coordinated election being conducted by the Clerk on November 2, 2021. The City Council hereby
32 determines that at the Election, there shall be submitted to the qualified and registered electors of
33 the City the following question:

1 Denver Facilities System Bonds

2 SHALL THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER DEBT BE INCREASED \$[294,040,000], WITH A
3 MAXIMUM REPAYMENT COST OF \$[506,017,000], WITH NO EXPECTED INCREASE IN THE
4 CITY'S CURRENT RATE OF TAXATION FOR GENERAL OBLIGATION DEBT SERVICE BASED
5 ON THE CITY'S PROJECTED ASSESSED VALUE, THE PROCEEDS THEREOF TO BE USED
6 FOR REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE DENVER FACILITIES SYSTEM, WHICH MAY
7 INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- 8 • CONSTRUCTION OF A MULTI-USE ARENA FOR CONCERTS, LOCAL AND HIGH
9 SCHOOL SPORTING EVENTS, RODEO, AND OTHER ENTERTAINMENT EVENTS; AND
- 10 • RENOVATION AND PRESERVATION OF AN HISTORIC BUILDING AT THE NATIONAL
11 WESTERN CENTER TO CREATE A PUBLIC MARKET; AND
- 12 • CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS, AND OTHER FACILITY REPAIRS AT
13 DENVER BOTANIC GARDENS, BONFILS THEATER COMPLEX, DENVER MUSEUM OF
14 NATURE AND SCIENCE, AND DENVER ZOO; AND
- 15 • PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF THE MAY BONFILS STANTON THEATER AT
16 THE HISTORIC LORETTO HEIGHTS CAMPUS FOR USE AS A PERFORMING AND
17 CULTURAL ARTS VENUE; AND
- 18 • RENOVATION OF AN EXISTING CITY-OWNED FACILITY INTO A YOUTH
19 EMPOWERMENT CENTER; AND
- 20 • CONSTRUCTION OF TWO NEW LIBRARIES AND UPGRADING EXISTING LIBRARIES TO
21 INCLUDE CHILDREN'S LEARNING AREAS, COMMUNITY SPACES, AND TECHNOLOGY
22 LABS; AND
- 23 • ACCESSIBILITY IMPROVEMENTS TO DENVER FACILITIES FOR PEOPLE WITH
24 DISABILITIES;

25 BY THE ISSUANCE AND PAYMENT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, NOTES, LOAN
26 AGREEMENTS OR OTHER MULTIPLE FISCAL YEAR FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS, WHICH
27 SHALL BE ISSUED OR INCURRED IN SUCH MANNER AND CONTAINING SUCH TERMS
28 NOT INCONSISTENT HERewith AS THE CITY MAY DETERMINE (THE EXPENDITURE OF
29 THE PROCEEDS THEREOF TO BE PUBLICLY REPORTED BY THE CITY ON AN ANNUAL
30 BASIS); AND SHALL CITY AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES BE INCREASED WITHOUT
31 LIMITATION AS TO RATE BUT BY NOT MORE THAN A MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF
32 \$[54,404,000] ANNUALLY IN AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM,

1 IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON SUCH FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS OR TO CREATE A RESERVE
2 FOR SAME; AND SHALL THE CITY BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS TO
3 REFUND OR REFINANCE SUCH FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS AUTHORIZED IN THIS QUESTION,
4 PROVIDED THAT SUCH REFUNDING FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS WHEN COMBINED WITH
5 OTHER OUTSTANDING FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS AUTHORIZED IN THIS QUESTION DO NOT
6 EXCEED THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL LIMITS OR REPAYMENT COSTS AUTHORIZED BY THIS
7 QUESTION?

8 Section 4. The Clerk is hereby appointed as the designated election official of the City for
9 purposes of performing acts required or permitted by law in connection with the Election.

10 Section 5. The officers and employees of the City are hereby authorized and directed to
11 take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this ordinance.

12 Section 6. If a majority of the votes cast on the question to authorize general obligation
13 indebtedness and the levy of ad valorem property taxes submitted at the Election shall be in favor
14 of incurring general obligation indebtedness and levying ad valorem property taxes as provided in
15 such question, the City, acting through the Mayor and City Council, shall be authorized to proceed
16 with the necessary action to incur general obligation indebtedness and levy ad valorem property
17 taxes in accordance with such question. Any authority to contract general obligation indebtedness
18 or to levy ad valorem property taxes, if conferred by the results of the Election, shall be deemed and
19 considered a continuing authority to contract the general obligation indebtedness and levy the ad
20 valorem taxes so authorized at any one time, or from time to time, and neither the partial exercise
21 of the authority so conferred, nor any lapse of time, shall be considered as exhausting or limiting the
22 full authority so conferred.

23 Section 7. If a majority of the votes cast on the question authorize the incurrence of general
24 obligation indebtedness and levy of an ad valorem property tax as described in the question set forth
25 in Section 3 above, the City intends to issue or incur such general obligation indebtedness in the
26 approximate aggregate principal amount of \$[294,040,000] to pay the costs of the certain public
27 improvements described in the election question (the "Project") including the reimbursement of
28 certain costs incurred by the City prior to the execution and delivery of such bonds, upon terms
29 acceptable to the City, as authorized in an ordinance to be hereafter adopted and to take all further
30 action which is necessary or desirable in connection therewith. The officers, employees and agents
31 of the City shall take all action necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to and
32 consummate the transactions contemplated hereby and shall take all action necessary or desirable
33 to finance the Project and to otherwise carry out the transactions contemplated by the ordinance.

1 This ordinance is intended to be a declaration of "official intent" to reimburse expenditures within the
2 meaning of Treasury Regulation § 1.150-2.

3 Section 8. Pursuant to Article XX of the State Constitution and the Charter, all State
4 statutes that might otherwise apply in connection with the provisions of this ordinance (including,
5 without limitation C.R.S. § 31-11-111) are hereby superseded to the extent of any inconsistencies
6 or conflicts between the provisions of this ordinance and such statutes. Any such inconsistency or
7 conflict is intended by the City Council and shall be deemed made pursuant to the authority of Article
8 XX of the State Constitution and the Charter.

9 Section 9. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this ordinance shall for any
10 reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section,
11 paragraph, clause or provision shall in no manner affect any remaining provisions of this ordinance.

12 Section 10. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed
13 to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any ordinance
14 or part of any ordinance heretofore repealed.
