

Committee Consent Agenda

Business, Workforce & Sustainability

- BR11- Accepts a Denver Enterprise Zone Marketing grant from the State of O204 Colorado Office of Economic Development in the amount of \$12,500 with an equal match from the City, to support marketing of activities, organizations, and projects in Denver Enterprise Zones.
- BR11- Approves a grant acceptance from HUD in the amount of \$2,026,698 with a City match of \$269,766 for the Lead Based Paint Hazard Control Program to address lead-based paint hazards in low to moderate income households in Denver over the next 3 years.
- BR11- Approves a contract with Northeast Denver Housing Center in the amount of \$2,280,444 through February 28,2014 to carry out the Lead Based Paint Hazard Control program.

General Government & Finance

- BR11- Approves a purchase order with Oracle America for a one-year term for the annual maintenance and support for PeopleSoft database in the amount of \$560,056.82.
- BR11- Approves closing out the Census 2010 Program in the Human Services Special Revenue Fund and transferring the cash balance of \$17,609.16 to the General Fund.

Health, Safety, Education & Services

- BR11- Approves an amendment to Denver Public Schools Head Start 0203 Agreement to extend the term 6 months and increase funding by an additional \$653,996 (GE00332-1).
- RR11- Approves the following mayoral reappointments of Lawrence Left Hand 0210 Bull and Carol Berry to the Denver American Indian Commission for a

term effective immediately and expiring November 11, 2011 and the mayoral appointments of Niabi Hart and Rose Red Elk to the Denver American Indian Commission for a term effective immediately and expiring January 11, 2013.

Land Use, Transportation & Infrastructure

- BR11- Approves an additional \$250,000 to the Purchase Order for tipping fees at the Denver and Arapahoe Disposal Site.
- RR11- Dedicates a parcel of land as Public Right of Way as Federal Boulevard located at the intersection of W. 12th Avenue and Federal Boulevard in Council District 3.

Routine, non-controversial requests for ordinances that are not substantive policy changes may be placed on Consent Agendas for Council Committees each week with the approval of Committee chairs. Councilmembers receive the consent agendas for review and have until Thursday at noon to request that an item be scheduled for Committee discussion. If approved, items are placed on the Mayor-Council agenda the following week. This document outlines the items that were placed on consent agendas this week.
