NSP Purpose: To acquire and redevelop foreclosed and vacant properties to reduce blight and

stabilize neighborhoods

Target Population: Households with incomes up to 120% of the Area Median Income. Twenty-five

percent of the funds must be used to assist households with income at or below 50%

AMI.

Eligible Properties: Foreclosed multi- and single-family properties, vacant and blighting properties,

vacant land. Properties must be located in neighborhoods highly impacted by

foreclosures.

NSP1: Total Funds: \$6,060,170 awarded by HUD through a formula allocation

\$3,620,176 awarded by the State of Colorado through a competitive

\$9,680,346 allocation based on a commitment to develop 22 homes

Expended: \$7,929,827 (82%); all funds are under contract

Primary Focus: Single family homes

Production: Purchased 92 homes to date

55 single family homes – 25 have to sold to income eligible households

36 multi-family units purchased and rehabbed (one building, all at up to 50% AMI)

The average AMI for homeowners is 66%

Average sales price of homes sold to date is \$155,447

NSP2: Total Funds: \$18,994,444 awarded by HUD through a competitive allocation based on our

transit-oriented development focus

Expended: \$2,292,641 (12%); \$14,112,561 (74%) is under contract

Primary Focus: Multi-family properties near transit

Production: Purchased or in the process of constructing 205 units with 129 (63%) set-aside for

households with income at or below 50% AMI

7 single family homes have been purchased and are being rehabilitated

Finalizing commitments for remainder of NSP 2 funding

Projects Pending: ARIA-Marycrest and Park Hill Community Apartments

NSP3: Total Funds: \$2,700,279 awarded by HUD through a formula allocation

Primary Focus: Single family homes in Globeville, West Colfax, Swansea Elyria, and Villa Park

Production: A Request for Proposals will be issued in May, 2011.
