A BILL

For an ordinance amending golf course fees under sub-section 39-121(2) and amending event facilities fees under sub-subsections 39-121(10) (b) and (c) of the Revised Municipal Code.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. That subsection 2 (Golf course fees) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by deleting the language and numbers stricken and adding the language and numbers underlined, as follows:

Sec. 39-121. (2) *Golf course fees:*

a. *Annual fees:*

Unlimited play for Denver residents only (not good on Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays or holidays) includes reservation card \$550.00
Plus, per round, 9 holes 4.00
Plus, per round, 18 holes 6.00

b. *Course fees:*

4. At City Park, Willis Case, Overland, Kennedy, Evergreen, and Wellshire Golf Courses, the following fees shall apply:

37 **Section 2.** That sub-sub-subsection b. (Special events) of subsection 10 (Parks permit fee
38 schedule) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter
39 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by deleting the
40 language and numbers stricken and adding the language and numbers underlined, as follows:

42 b. Special events (including festivals, races, walks, and special occasions). The
43 manager shall designate which locations within parks subject to permitting fall under the categories
44 in the table below. The duration of time blocks shall be established by the manager of parks and
