Phil Washington has a long track record of managing public agencies with large budgets and close partnerships with Federal agencies, and leading innovative and transformative projects. From 2000 to 2015, Phil served as Assistant General Manager (2000-2009) and General Manager and CEO (2009-2015) for metro Denver's Regional Transportation District (RTD). As RTD GM, Phil led and implemented the FasTracks program, one of the largest voter-approved transportation expansion programs in the country at the time. He also implemented the nation's first and only \$2.2 billion transit public-private partnership (P3), resulting in the University of Colorado A Line, which opened in 2016. For the last six years Phil has served as CEO of the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority – the lead transportation planning, programming and financing agency for Los Angeles County and one of the largest transportation departments in the United States. As LA Metro's CEO, Washington managed a balanced budget in excess of \$8 billion a year, was responsible for overseeing between \$18-\$20 billion in capital projects and provided oversight of an agency with 11,000 employees that transports 1.2 million boarding passengers daily. Phil also recently led the Biden/Harris transition's transportation team, helping review and set the policy agenda and procedures of the U.S. Department of Transportation for the then incoming Biden Administration.
