**A BILL**

**For an ordinance approving Department of Public Works annual programs for 2017 and waiving the need for further City Council approval for specific contracts to be let pursuant to the annual programs.**

**WHEREAS**, under Charter § 3.2.6, the City Council has the authority to approve contracts of \$500,000 or more; and

**WHEREAS**, under Charter § 3.2.6(H), the City Council has the authority to waive the requirement that such contracts be submitted to the council for approval or disapproval under Charter § 3.2.6, and

**WHEREAS**, City Council has reviewed the 2017 annual programs for the Department of Public Works which consists of:

14 reports to City Council listing all contracts let under its annual program, including the name of the  
15 contractor, the amount of the contract, the term of the contract, the M/WBE goals established for  
16 each contract and which contracts are included in the SBE set aside program. The Department of  
17 Public Works shall meet with City Council to discuss the annual programs quarterly or as requested  
18 by City Council.


