This is the operating plan and budget for **Bluebird BID** and it is submitted annually.

General Description of District and Location: The service area consists of approximately 11.3 acres of certain commercial property generally located along Colfax Avenue between St. Paul Street to the west, Colorado Boulevard to the east, 16th Avenue to the north and 14th Avenue to the south.

Business Improvement Districts (BID's) are organized for the benefit of commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and their maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities. The Bluebird BID will be authorized to provide services within and without its boundaries, including consulting with respect to planning or managing development activities; promotion or marketing activities; organization, promotion, marketing and management of public events; activities in support of business recruitment, management and development; security for businesses and public areas; and providing design assistance.

District Structure: The district has no debt, the 2016 budget includes a 10 mill levy. The proposed budgetary expenditures for 2016 are \$131,217. The Board of Directors is composed of 7 property owners.

For all BIDs that have mill levies: City Council will pass a resolution in December to levy all special district mill levies for the 2016 budget year.
