 - a. Scope of Work

The Fire Department is requesting to purchase a fire education mobile safety trailer to replace its existing trailer, originally donated by former Councilwoman Cathy Reynolds. This equipment is a significant component of the Fire Department's Safety and Emergency Preparedness Education program. The fire safety mobile trailer is a mobile version of a private house, complete with furnishings, mounted on a trailer. This equipment provides a visual aid for general fire safety and accident prevention methods, including infused smoke to simulate real-life fire conditions. Participants practice effective fire evacuation techniques in a realistic setting, making this an excellent tool for teaching home escape plans as well as fire and burn hazards. The trailer is also used at community sponsored events and the Denver Public Schools Simply Safe Program during the school year. Without this equipment, it will be difficult to demonstrate fire safety techniques and may result in increased risk to public safety.
