5 **ABILL**

6 **For an Ordinance to amend, restate and supersede Ordinance No. 0868, Series of**
7 **2021, designating the projects to be undertaken and funded with the proceeds of**
8 **any general obligations bonds authorized by voters at the November 2, 2021**
9 **election.**

10 **WHEREAS**, Council approved and adopted Ordinance No. 0868, Series of 2021, designating
11 the projects to be undertaken and funded with the proceeds of any general obligation bonds authorized
12 by voters at the November 2, 2021 election (the “Original Companion Ordinance”); and

13 **WHEREAS**, Section 3 of the Original Companion Ordinance provided that, “[within] each
14 purpose, any modifications to add or remove a line item project will require an amendment to [the
15 Original Companion Ordinance] by the Denver City Council whenever a line item project set forth in
16 [the Original Companion Ordinance] includes a list of specific locations where the project will be
17 undertaken, any modification to remove any listed located will require an amendment to [the Original
18 Companion Ordinance] by the Denver City Council;” and

19 **WHEREAS**, certain amendments to the line item project list contained within the Original
20 Companion Ordinance are needed since the adoption of the Original Companion Ordinance,
21 necessitating an amendment to the Original Companion Ordinance in conformance with Section 3
22 thereof; and

23 **WHEREAS**, the City desires to amend, restate and supersede Ordinance No. 0868, Series of
24 2021 in its entirety, with additions to the Original Companion Ordinance noted below in bold type, and
25 deletions noted below by being struck-through, all as detailed herein.

27 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

28 **Section 1.** The Mayor and Council designate the following projects and level of funding to be
29 undertaken with the proceeds of any general obligations bonds authorized by voters at the November
30 2, 2021 election.

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Section 2. If any project listed in Section 1 of this Ordinance is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the other parts and provisions of any general obligations bonds authorized by voters at the November 2, 2021 election and this Ordinance.

Section 3. Within each purpose, any modifications to add or remove a line item project will require an amendment of this Ordinance by the Denver City Council. Whenever a line item project set forth in this Ordinance includes a list of specific locations where the project will be undertaken, any modification to remove any listed location will require an amendment to this Ordinance by the Denver City Council.

Section 4. The Chief Financial Officer, as the Manager of Finance/*Ex-Officio* Treasurer shall describe progress of the expenditure of the funds for each purpose listed above in a report to a committee of the Denver City Council at least annually.


Section 5. This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage by the electorate of the November 2, 2021 ballot question(s) that authorize the any general obligation bonds for the purposes referenced herein.

Section 6. This Ordinance amends, restates and supersedes Ordinance No. 0868, Series of 2021, in its entirety.
