BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Monies received from contributions, donations, project incomes or other source of private receipts shall be deposited into the Treasury of the City and credited to Special Fund No. 1500 which is set forth and described in Section 20-18 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver.

Section 2. Expenditures are hereby authorized from the Human Rights and Community Relations Special Revenue Fund, Auditor's No. 1568-1110, ^{an} in the amount of \$1,500; except upon approval and authorization by Council acting by ordinance, ~~not to exceed the total of deposits described in Section 1 of this ordinance, to be expended for the purposes of the Agency by the Mayor or his lawful successor or duly authorized agents.~~

Section 3. Funds shall be used for purchase of equipment, furniture and supplies, and services provided in connection with programs and events of the Agency for Human Rights and Community Relations individual commissions.

Section 4. The Auditor and Treasurer of the City and County of Denver are hereby authorized and directed to make such book and record entries and to do such other things as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.
