6. General description of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:

The proposed resolution is to enable the City and County of Denver to comply with Colorado Statutes which will enable it to preserve its 2010 Private Activity Bond Volume Cap Allocation for use in future years. The State of Colorado’s Department of Local Affairs allocated \$27,517,905 of Volume Cap Allocation to the City and County of Denver for 2010 and \$27,517,905 remains unused.

This Resolution allows \$27,517,905 of unused 2010 Volume Cap Allocation to be applied in future years, consistent with Colorado statutes and the Internal Revenue Code. Adoption of this Resolution enables the City to keep the unused allotment for future Denver projects rather than reverting the cap back to the State. The carry forward allocation will be issued for the purpose of Single Family Mortgage Revenue Bonds, Multifamily Housing Bonds or Mortgage Credit Certificates.
