The project is utalizing an industry- and employer-driven approach to develop an education and training career pathway, boosting employment in middle-skilled to high-skilled jobs.						
fou Inv Sys sec	The TEC-P grant application was led by the Denver Office of Economic Development (OED), which is serving as fiscal agent of the four-year project.
