15 16 17	<b>Section 1.</b> There is hereby submitted to the properly qualified and registered electors of the City and County of Denver for their approval or rejection at a special municipal election to be			
18	conducted at the same time and in conjunction with the state odd-year election to be held in the			
19	City and County of Denver on November 5, 2013, a proposed amendment to the Charter of the			
20	City and County of Denver, as follows:

22	Effective upon publication and filing v	with the Secretary of State pursuant to the		
23	Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado, the following sections of the 2002			
24	Charter of the City and County of Denver shall be and are hereby amended to read

27	Amend section 2.2.10 by adding a new subsection	n (D) to read as follows:

29	(D) Notwithstanding the use of the word "Manager" to denote the officers in charge of			
30	the principle departments under the Mayor as set forth in this Article II, the Mayor			
31	may order a different or additional title to be utilized by these officers for the purpose			
32	of standardizing and modernizing official titles consistent with best practices.

- Amend the introductory sentence of section 2.3.3 by deleting the language stricken, to read as 1 2 follows: 3 § 2.3.3 Powers and duties of Department of Public Works. The following duties and powers are hereby vested exclusively in the 4 5 Department of Public Works. 6 7 Amend the introductory sentence of section 2.4.4 by deleting the language stricken, to read as 8 follows: 9 § 2.4.4 Powers and duties of Department of Parks and Recreation. 10 The following duties and powers are hereby vested exclusively in the Department of Parks 11 and Recreation. 12 Amend subsection (C) of section 2.5.3 by adding the language underlined, to read as follows: § 2.5.3 Powers and duties of the Manager of Finance. 13 14 (C) Bank Depository; Investment of funds. The Manager of Finance shall, with the approval of the Mayor, select one or more banking or savings and loan institutions for 15 deposit of public funds. Before any deposit shall be made, the bank or savings and 16 17 loan institution shall pledge sufficient collateral as required by law. The Manager is 18 authorized to invest the funds in his or her custody or possession in the following 19 securities: obligations of the United States Government, obligations of the United 20 States Government agencies and United States Government sponsored 21 corporations, prime bankers acceptances, prime commercial paper, certificates of 22 deposit issued by banks and savings and loan institutions, repurchase agreements, 23 security lending agreements, highly rated municipal securities, money market funds that purchase only the types of securities specified herein, any investment type in 24 which the Colorado state treasurer is allowed to invest state moneys if otherwise 25 26 compliant with the Department's investment policy, and other similar securities as 27 may be authorized by ordinance. 28 29 Amend subsection (C) of section 2.11.3 by adding the language underlined, to read as 30 follows: 31

The following duties and powers are hereby vested in the Department of Aviation:

1	(C) Employment of professional and technical personnel. In the manner pursuant to			
2	terms and conditions fixed by the Mayor and the Cabinet, to employ qualified			
3	professional or technical personnel for the performance of the duties imposed on or			
4	the powers invested in the Department. The Manager of Aviation may, at the

36	REFERRED QUESTION			

Shall the Charter of the City and County of Denver be amended concerning the authority and functions of the various departments under the Mayor, to permit the Mayor to assign alternate titles to department managers, to eliminate the exclusivity of certain departmental functions, to expand options for investment of city funds by the Manager of Finance consistent with state law, to allow the Manager of Aviation to appoint up to five persons to serve in executive or managerial positions, and to allow the appointment of designees to serve on the Board of Equalization?

**Section 3**. Each elector voting at the election and wishing to vote for or against the amendment shall indicate the elector's choice by depressing the appropriate counter of the voting machine which indicates the word "YES" or the word "NO", or by appropriate marking upon paper ballots when used.

**Section 4.** The proper officials of the City and County of Denver as are charged with duties relating to the election shall, before the election, issue such calls, make such certifications and publications, give such notices, make such appointments, and do all such other acts and things in connection with the submission of this Charter amendment to the registered electors of the City and County of Denver at the election as are required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.

**Section 5.** The ballots cast at such election shall be canvassed and the results ascertained, determined, and certified in accordance with the requirements of the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.

**Section 6.** If any section, paragraph, clause, or other portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance shall not be affected.

**Section 7.** If approved by the voters, the Charter amendments set forth herein shall be effective January 1, 2014.
