DENVER

- Infrastructure Modification to Cloud-Hosting
 - DIA's Enterprise Asset Management system (EAM) will move
 from a locally-hosted platform to an IBM cloud-hosted system.
- IBM Services
 - IBM consultants will lead DIA staff in configuration, installation, testing, and training on the newly upgraded Maximo EAM 7.5 System.
 - IBM will further assist DIA staff through post "go-live' support of Maximo 7.5 for software patches or fixes.

Business Case Summary

Current challenges:

- The existing proprietary software (Maximo 6.2.8) is no longer supported by IBM and is over 15 years old.
- The cost to maintain an older version of Maximo is increasing daily due to the need to continuously involve a 3rd part solution provider.
- Costs associated with massive amount of customizations within the current system are excessively high due to the need for extensive regression testing each time the system is patched or update.
- System process and procedures shall be remodeled to be in accordance with industry best practices rather then subjective ease of use.
