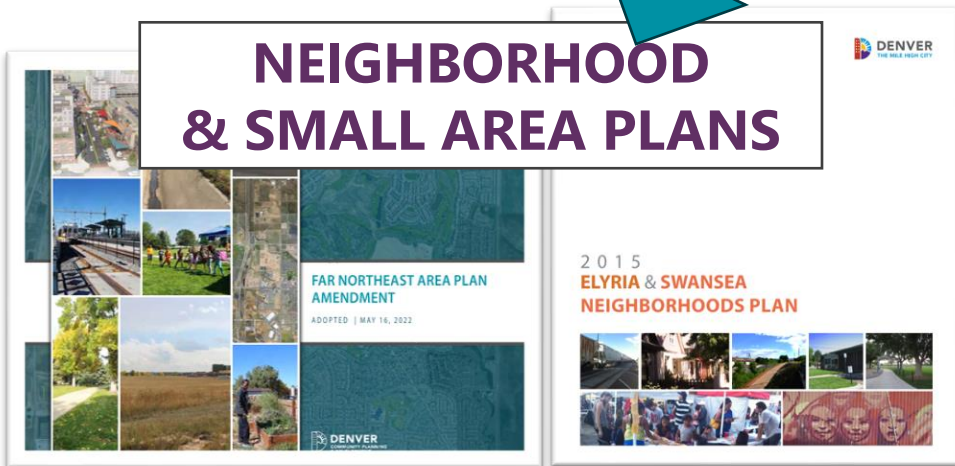

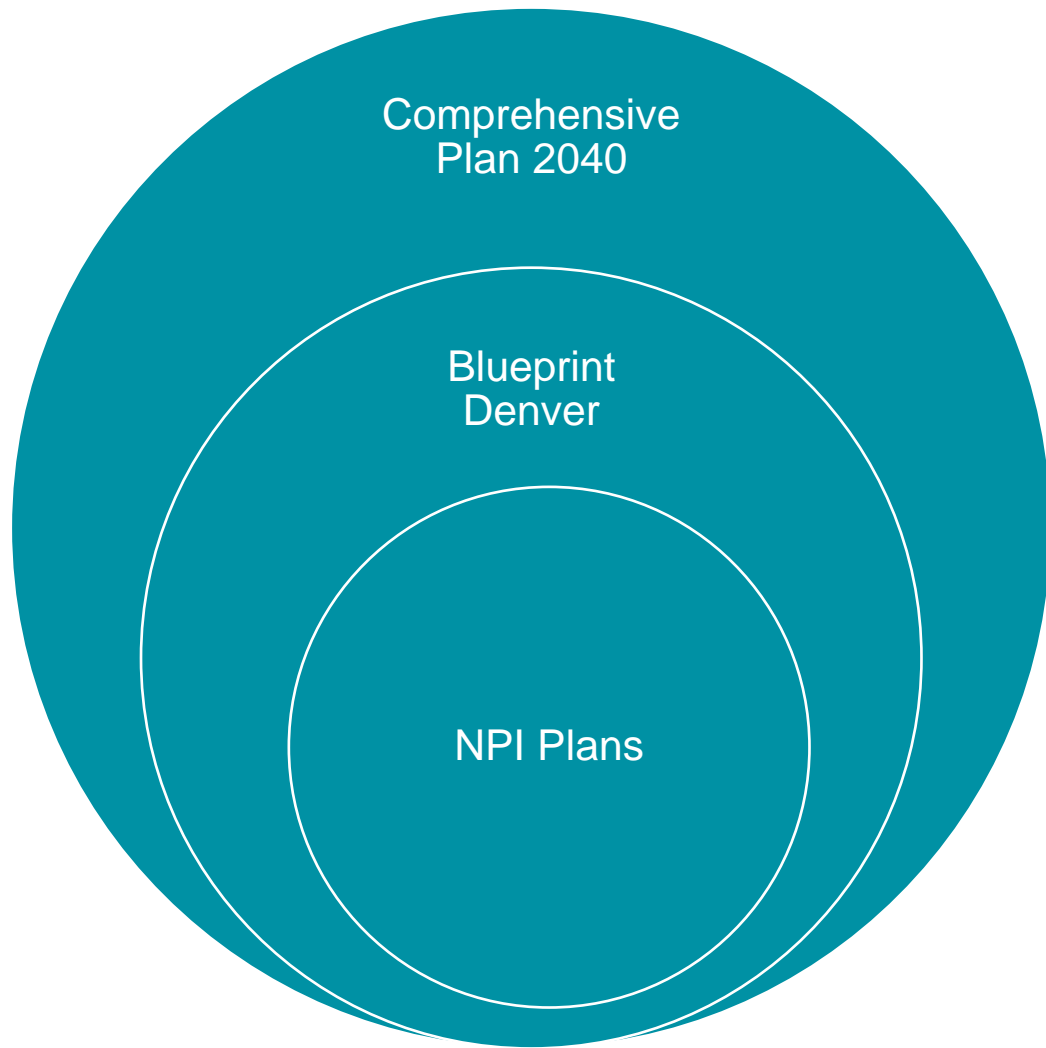

Program Intent

A planning process that is more efficient and equitable

Plans that are easier to understand and use

Plans that are better set up for implementation



Summary of Improvements

What are the major changes made through the NPI Evaluation?

1. Plan process improvements
2. Plan content improvements

A Better Process

Expand outreach and “saturate” engagement at the start of each planning process

Conduct a statistically valid survey

Employ community navigators throughout

Use advisory committee to get broader input on steering the process

Create focus group devoted to engagement equity



A Better Process

Streamline visioning by consolidating first two planning phases and using Blueprint Denver and Comprehensive Plan 2040 as a foundation

Using on-call consultants to speed up procurement process

Complete plans in about 18 months



Stronger, focused plans

Focus on Blueprint and Comp Plan topics and follow Blueprint organization

Outcome-oriented policies and strategies

Reduce repetition

Limit additional content

Clearer language and easier to understand



Actionable Plans

Include detailed Implementation Plan appendix

Identify priorities and next steps

Include staff from other departments

Rely on Blueprint metrics

- ✓ *Review by advisory committee*
- ✓ *Planning Board approval*
- ✓ *City Council adoption*

Keeping draft opportunities focused on topics from citywide plans



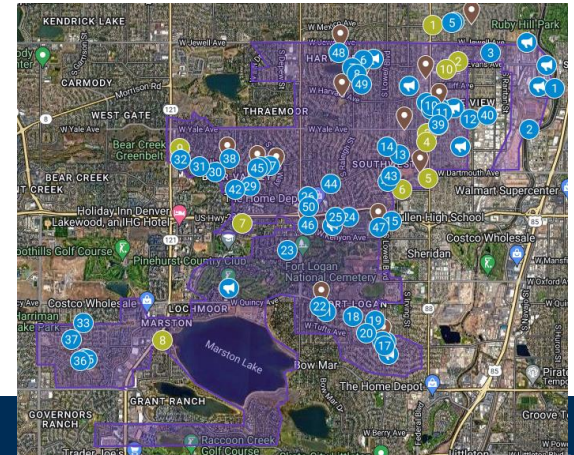
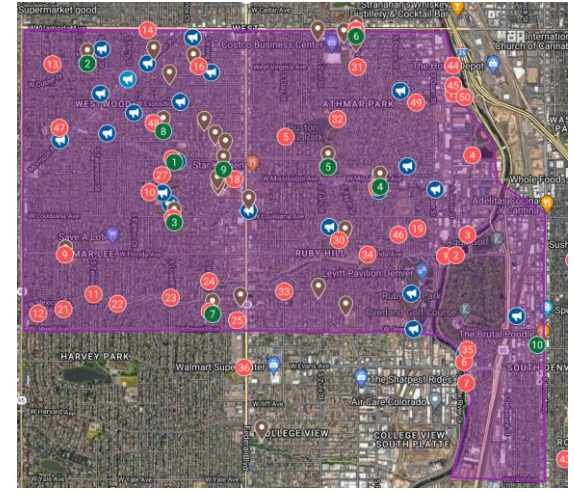
Saturation engagement

Determining next plan areas

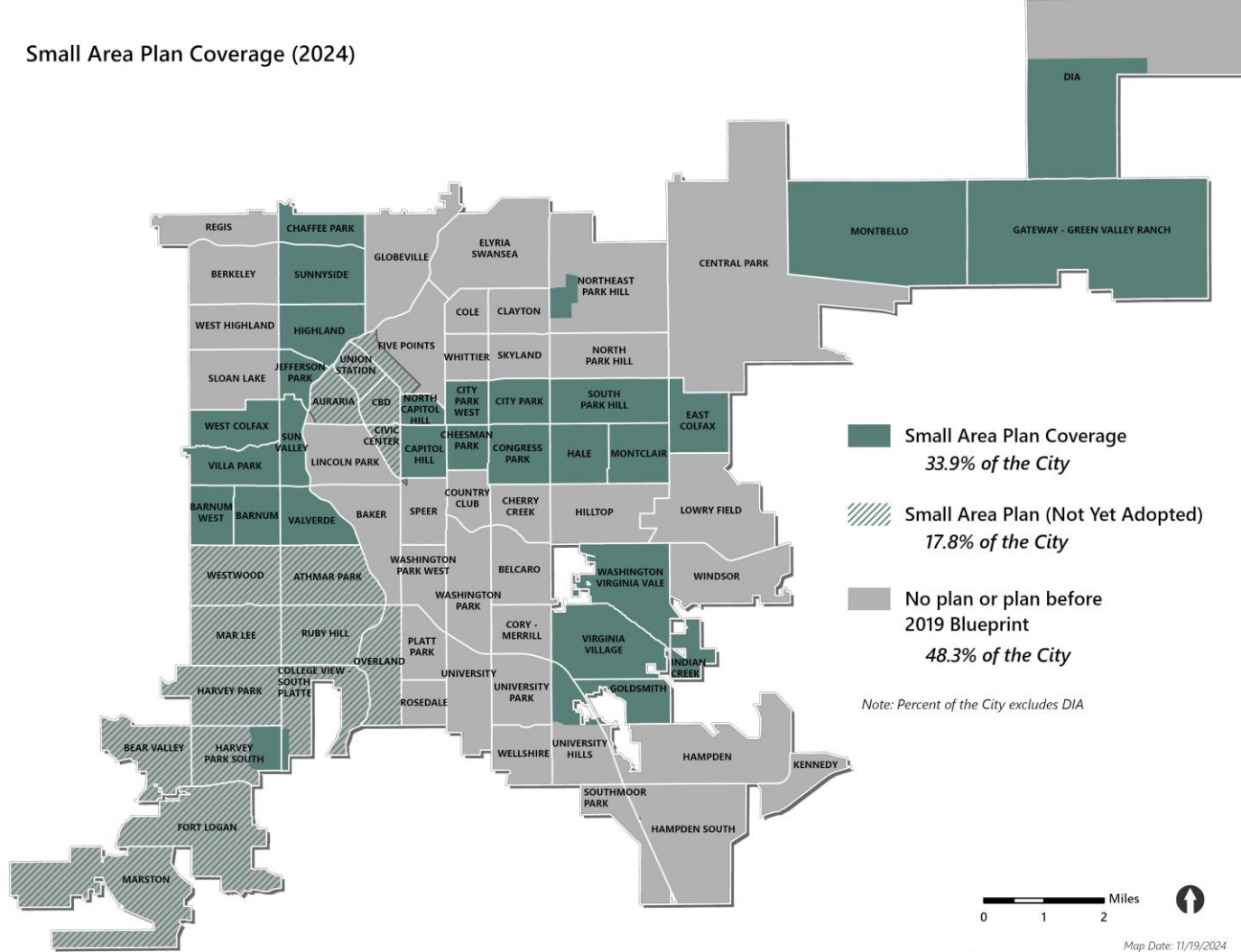
Plan Area Selection Criteria

- Indicators of planning need based on data
- Equity considerations incorporated with 2022 update
- Map layers citywide along 3 key themes (7 layers total):
 - **Equity** (Access to Opportunity, Vulnerability to Displacement, Housing Diversity)
 - **Investment** (Building Permits, CIP Projects, Underutilized Land)
 - **Plan Recency** (No small area plans since 2019)
- Identify areas with the greatest amounts of overlap and prioritize NPI plans in those areas
