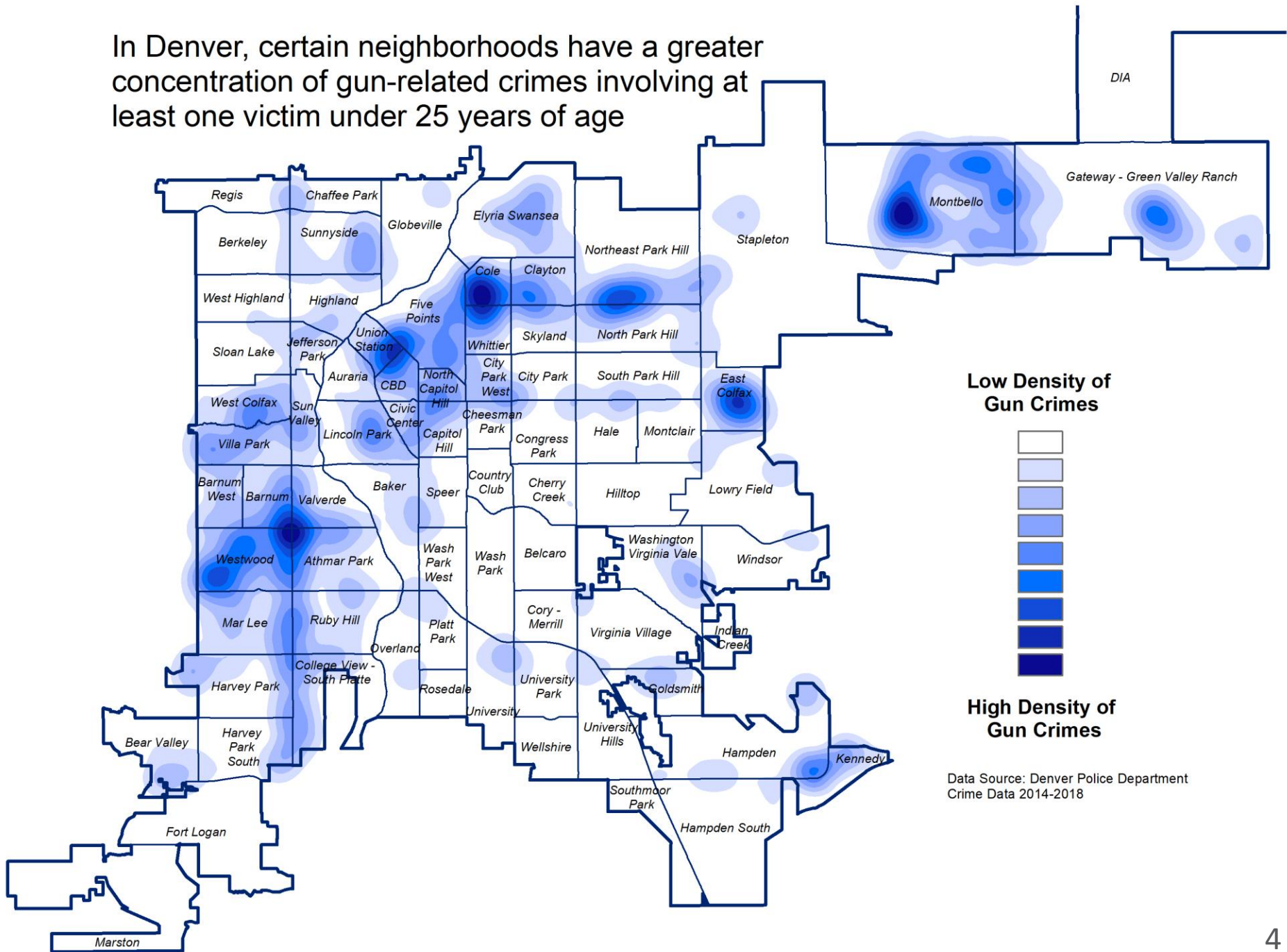

Youth Gun Violence Data

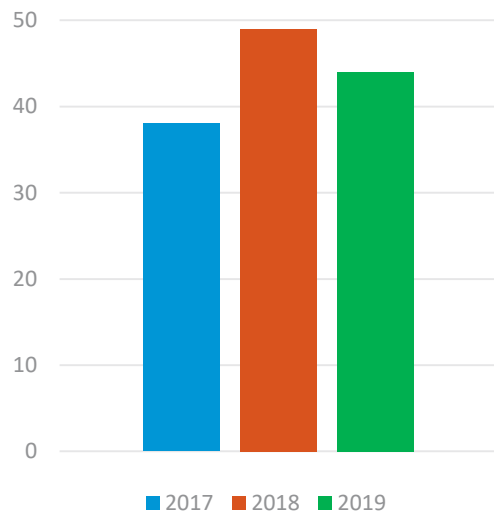


In Denver, certain neighborhoods have a greater concentration of gun-related crimes involving at least one victim under 25 years of age

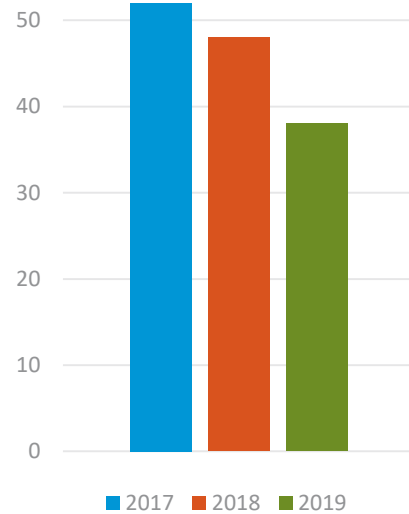

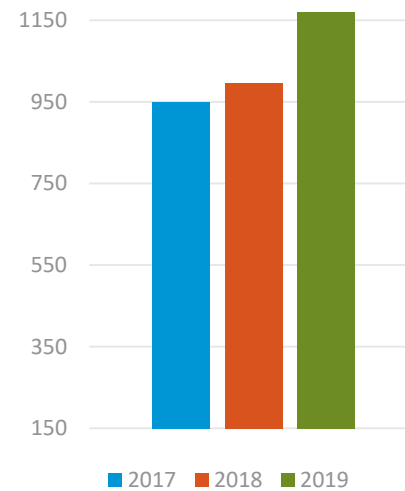

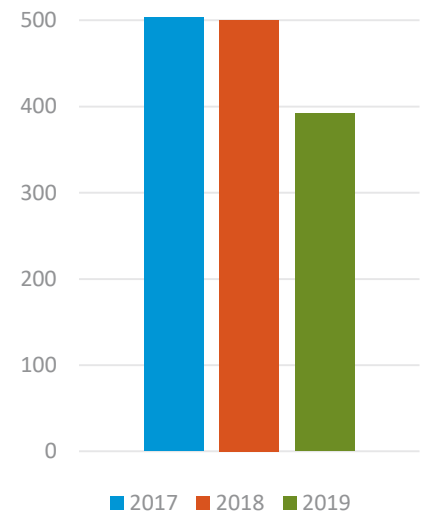
Suicide



Aggravated Assault-Total

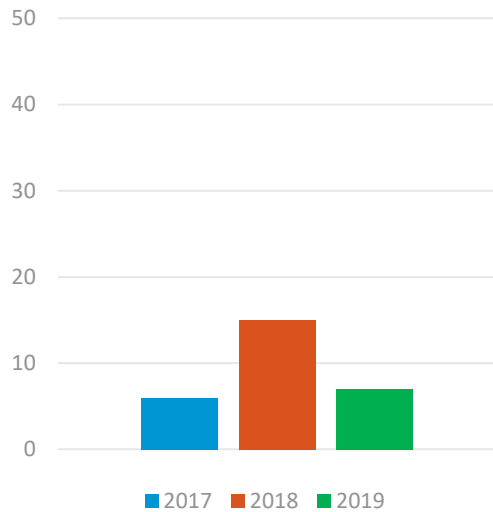


Robbery-Total

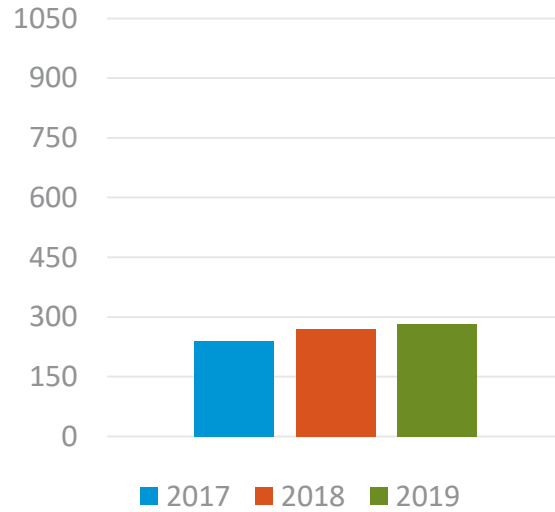

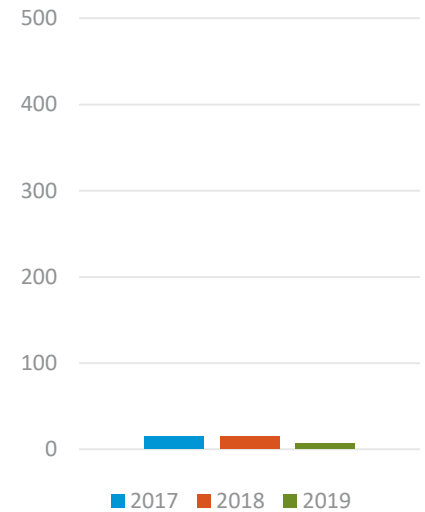

Impacts of Youth Gun Violence



Juvenile Health Concerns

Mental health issues: anxiety, depression, and PTSD

Negative impact on school attendance

Lack of positive social engagement and adolescent development

Potential to join a gang for protection and a sense of belonging

- The entire community's health is impacted due to fear of crime and a reluctance to leave their homes
- This has a direct impact on the vitality, socialization, and economy of our neighborhoods

- Task: Develop Comprehensive Youth Violence Prevention Plan by end of 2020.
- Connect, align, and maximize all resources to support a comprehensive approach.
- Phase 1: Connect, map and align city and system resources.
- Phase 2: Feedback from community-based organizations, residents including youth to inform prioritization of strategies.
- Phase 3: Evaluate recommended strategies to determine potential impact.
- Phase 4: Deliver Youth Violence Prevention Plan to Mayor's Office.

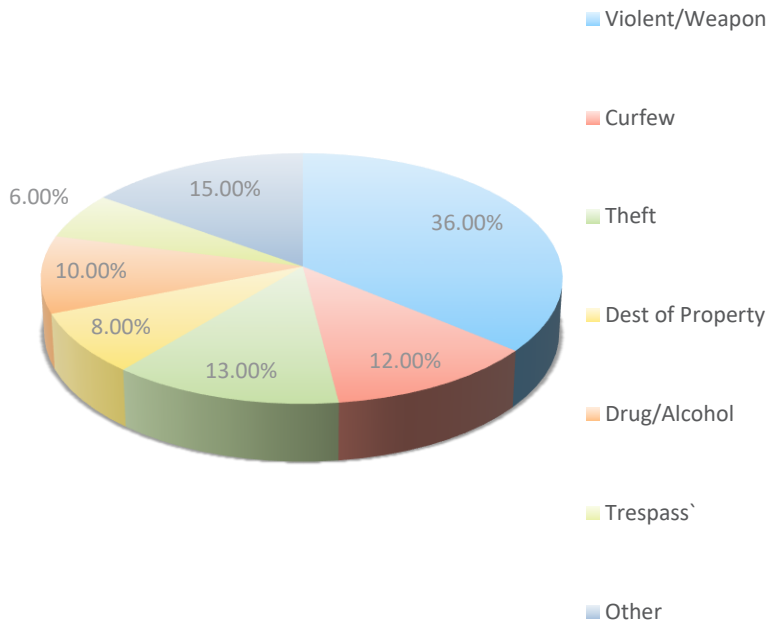

- Evidence-based curriculum
- Partnership with Vuela for Health
- 7 Spanish-language sessions
 - 64 parents/caregivers
 - 62 youth

Intervention

- Alternative to Citation (ATC) Pilot
- North and West HS
- Reduction of 16% and 71% respectively in citations issued in first semester.
- Schools now referring without considering citation – Voluntary Diversion.
