- 5. Describe the proposed ordinance, including what the proposed ordinance is intended to accomplish, who’s involved**
  - a. Scope of Work**
    - The grant award dated December 7, 2011 in the amount of \$130,000.00 will mutually benefit and sustain the Denver Youth Healthy Connections/25th Judicial District Denver Juvenile Probation Department TASC Project – a collaborative effort between trained DPD officers and Denver Juvenile Court.
    - Funding is being provided from three federal sources
      - Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Awards (CFDA# 93.243) in the amount of \$100,000
      - Department of Justice – Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (CFDA# 16.726) in the amount of \$13,500
      - Department of Justice – Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (CFDA# 16.730) in the amount of \$16,500
    - Cumulative awards have now exceeded \$500,000, reaching a total of \$620,000 with this latest award as detailed above.
