2. 1 District lines will be drawn to avoid subjecting the city to equal protection claims arising on behalf of any person in a protected class based on race, 2 ethnicity, or national origin. Race and ethnicity will not be the predominant 3 factor determining the location of district boundaries if to do so would 4 subordinate the other traditional race-neutral districting principles set forth 5 herein. However, race and ethnicity will be taken into account to the 6 extent necessary to comply with the Voting Rights Act and to avoid claims 7 arising thereunder. 8 9 3. District lines will be drawn to create districts that are as compact as 10 possible and contain contiguous territory. District lines will follow obvious 11 geographic boundaries to the extent possible. 12 13 4. Council districts will be comprised of whole election precincts, as required 14 by Section C1.15-1 3.1.2 of the Charter of the City and County of Denver. 15 Council will urge the Election Commission Clerk & Recorder to draw 16 precinct boundaries that will facilitate reasonable Council district 17 boundaries. 18 19 20 5. Council will make every effort to consolidate traditional neighborhoods within one district to avoid multiple representation and to maintain as 21 much as possible the existing relationships between council members and 22 their present constituents. In order to help accomplish this goal, Council 23 will urge the Election Commission Clerk & Recorder to draw the 24 boundaries of each precinct wholly within a neighborhood. 25 26 Council will endeavor to preserve logical communities of interest and to 6. 27 preserve the core of existing constituencies traditionally represented by a 28 particular Council district. 29 30 7. The City Council President will has appointed a Redistricting Committee 38 responsible for coordinating the redistricting process and working with 39 Denver GIS within the City's Information Technology Services Division to 40 obtain the necessary statistical information, appropriate census population 41 tabulations, and maps of the City and County of Denver. 42 43 2.
