The ordinance represents the City's approval for the expenditures necessary to execute the responsibilities of the district as well as the imposition of a mill levy necessary to generate sufficient revenue to pay the district's expenses.

- c. Location: The district is located in central Denver from Broadway Avenue to the east alley of Josephine Street to 14th Avenue and from 16th Avenue.

Benefits: Business Improvement Districts (BIDs) are organized for the benefit of commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and their maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities. This district was created to provide a mechanism to strengthen the business environment of the east Colfax corridor through advertising and promoting of the businesses within the BID boundaries. The district provides services such as streetscape maintenance and trash receptacles. The district includes only business property.
- f. Costs: Districts are self funded with no direct costs to the City. The district has no debt and historically has assessed a mill levy of 7.846 mills. The 2012 budget contemplates leaving the mill levy unchanged from 2011. The mill levy will cover budgetary expenditures for 2012 which are **\$451,500**.

Executive Summary
Colfax BID
2012 Work Plan and Budget

Business Improvement Districts (BID's) are organized for the benefit of commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and their maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities. This is the operating plan and budget for Colfax BID and it is submitted annually.

General Description of District and Location: The Colfax Business Improvement District, also known as the Colfax on the Hill District is located in central Denver from Broadway Avenue to the east alley of Josephine Street - 14th Avenue and from 16th Avenue.

The district was created to provide a mechanism to strengthen the business environment of the east Colfax corridor through advertising and promoting of the businesses within the BID boundaries. The District also provides services such as streetscape maintenance and trash receptacles. The District only includes commercial property and funds its operations by imposing a mill levy on commercial property owners and collection of the specific ownership tax.

District Structure: The district has no debt and historically has assessed a mill levy of 7.846 mills. The 2012 budget contemplates leaving the mill levy unchanged from 2011. The mill levy will cover budgetary expenditures for 2012 which are **\$451,500**. The Board of Directors is composed of 5 citizens.

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
