7 8 9	For an ordinance amending Articles I and III of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver regarding licensing of dogs and cats.		
10 11	WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to require licensing of dogs and cats because licensing		
12	enables the reunion of missing pets with their owners; reduces crowding in animal shelters; helps		
13	to identify and control stray animals;		
14	WHEREAS, licensing of dogs and cats over the age of six months, and certain vaccinations,		
15	have been required since 1995 but it is estimated that less than 10% of Denver pets are currently		
16	licensed and the vaccination rate is unknown;		
17	WHEREAS, repeal of the documentary proof of vaccination prior to licensing and replacing		
18	that pre-condition with certification of vaccination during the licensing process retains the		
19	requirement for vaccinations and will promote the public interest in licensed pets while maintaining		
20	protection of public health and welfare.		
21	WHEREAS, expanded opportunities to apply for and receive licenses is anticipated to		
22	enhance compliance with the licensing requirements of the city and provide additional information		
23	for the Department's follow-up with pet owners to improve vaccination compliance rates.		
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:		
25	Section 1. That a new section 8-6 of Article I of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal		
26	Code shall be adopted by adding the language underlined as follows:		
27	"Sec. 8-6. Unlawful to give false information.		
28	It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to make, convey or cause to be		
29	imparted or conveyed, false statements in applications or to furnish, present or		
30	exhibit any fictitious or false documentation pursuant to this chapter."		
31	Section 2. That Section 8-63 of Article III of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal Code		
32	shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined as		
33	follows:		

"Sec. 8-63. License; issuance.

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- (a) Licenses may be applied for in person, by telephone, by mail, or online by the owner of a dog or cat or an owner's representative. Upon filing of the completed application, either online, in person, by telephone or by mail, and payment of the <u>license fee, necessary fees, and after receipt of satisfactory</u> proof of rabies immunization, the manager or person lawfully designated and authorized to issue licenses on the manager's behalf shall issue to the applicant a one-year license to the applicant for the current year for a one-year license and or a three-year license for the current and two subsequent years for a three year license provided, however, that three year licenses shall only be issued for dogs and cats with a valid three years rabies vaccination. Licensed veterinarians may be designated to issue licenses upon receipt of a properly completed application and fee, or they may and submit applications for licenses on behalf of their clients, and as provided by the board of environmental health., the manager may nominally compensate veterinarians for submitting processing licenses.
- (b) The license tag shall be attached to the each licensed dog or cat at all times when it is off the property of the owner by means of a collar or harness, and it shall be unlawful to place this tag on any dog or cat animal other than the dog or cat for which the license was issuedpurchased.
- (c) The license tag shall be attached to each licensed cat at all times when it is off the property of the owner by means of a collar or harness unless the cat bears a visible tattoo or identifiable microchip, and it shall be unlawful to place this tag on any animal other than the cat for which the license was issued."
- Section 3. That Section 8-63 of Article III of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined as follows:

"Sec. 8-64. Rabies vaccination certification requirement.

Licenses shall not be issued for any dog or cat unless satisfactory proof of rabies vaccination is presented to the manager, unless such person presents to the manager a written statement from a licensed Colorado veterinarian that vaccination for rabies would be detrimental to the health of the specific dog or cat. The owner shall certify on the license application that the dog or cat has been vaccinated for rabies as required in division 2 of this Article II or shall agree to provide within thirty
