5. General description or background of proposed request. Attach executive summary if more space needed:

Since 2018, the city has contracted with Environmental Hazmat Services, Inc. to provide trained personnel to safely pick up sensitive and hazardous wastes that city staff are not trained or equipped to address. In 2020, this agreement was amended to include rapid response services whereby the contractor must provide on-site services within a 1 to 2 hour window of time at all hours of the day and night in facilitation of the arrest of individuals whose possessions or wastes require collection or disposal. This proposal extends the existing agreement from 3-years to 5-years and makes no other changes. The scope of work also includes collection, safe-keeping, storage and return of possessions temporarily relinquished by persons experiencing homelessness.

Scope of work: abandoned waste and illegal dumping solid waste clean-up

Assist multiple City agencies with the clean-up of City properties, including public rights-of-way. Contractor services will be required for both:

a) routine weekday projects and programs, and b) non-routine and urgent responses to a designated work site. Contractor to provide two or more laborers with a vehicle to support City staff to remove possessions and dispose of waste on City rights-of-way. Contractor will pick-up and dispose of abandoned wastes found on various properties and rights-of-way, additionally, contractor will pick-up and place in safe storage belongings of persons experiencing homelessness as directed by the City agency requesting the work (for example, DOTI or Parks). Waste that contractor staff may encounter during cleanups includes litter, food, spoiled food, human and animal waste, used syringes and other injection devices, articles contaminated with bodily fluids, and consumer chemical products. Contractor is required to collect items for safe keeping and short-term storage.

Provide labor and equipment to respond to all instances of abandonment and illegal dumping of solid wastes in the City, including collection and removal of feces, RV toilet blackwater, used syringes, other infectious material containing bodily fluids, spoiled food, clandestine drug lab wastes and paraphernalia, wastes deemed by the Fire Department to constitute a imminent risk of fire, tires, automotive wastes, and consumer electronics (TV's. etc) abandoned in parks and alleys.

Scope of work also includes collection, safe-keeping, storage and return of possessions temporarily relinquished by persons experiencing homelessness.
