On or before December 31, 2025, C.R.S. § 31-23-316 requires Denver to do one of the following:

1. Adopt an ordinance or resolution that incorporates the same standards and permitting process or less restrictive standards and permitting process as those described in the Colorado energy office's electric vehicle (EV) charger permitting model code;
2. Adopt an ordinance or resolution that establishes objective standards and an administrative review process to be used in review of EV charger permits, which must comply with certain state requirements; or
3. Adopt an ordinance or resolution that establishes that Denver does not intend to adopt the EV charger model code or adopt the standards and administrative review process specified by the state law, but instead will continue to utilize existing permitting review process for EV charging systems.

This resolution will fulfill the state requirement by selecting option 3 to continue using Denver's existing permitting review process for EV charging systems. Denver's zoning codes already allow EV charging as an accessory use throughout the city and allow EV charging as a primary use in several mixed use commercial zone districts, subject to limitations. This resolution will not preclude the City from making future changes to the permitting review process for EV charging.
