## **Executive Summary**

The Technology Employment Colorado Partnership (TECP), is an H-1B One Workforce grant program situated in DEDO, aimed at crafting replicable, holistic workforce strategies tailored for middle to high-skilled H-1B occupations across sectors like information technology, advanced manufacturing, and transportation.

Under TECP's purview, the grant focuses on fostering collaboration between economic regions in Colorado and industry partners to replicate successful workforce strategies. The initiative targets specific workforce development regions, including Adams, **Arapahoe/Douglas**, Boulder, Denver, Larimer, Jefferson/Clear Creek/Gilpin or Tri-Co, and Weld counties.

As the direct grant recipient, TECP allocates grant funds to seven subrecipient workforce development regions, facilitating the convergence of industry stakeholders, educational institutions, training providers, and local and state government entities. This collaborative effort aims to synchronize resources to meet employer demands and offer innovative education and job training solutions, leading to favorable outcomes.

TECP aims to benefit 750 individuals statewide aged 17 and above, not enrolled in secondary school. Arapahoe/Douglas Works! targets are included below.

These participants include both unemployed and underemployed individuals seeking full-time employment, as well as incumbent workers requiring upskilling or reskilling to either maintain their current employment or progress into middle-to high-skilled positions.

To date, TECP has positively impacted over 800 individuals statewide, including **200 residents of Denver**. Notably, 70% of these Denver participants identify as belonging to historically underserved ethnic groups such as American Indian, Asian, Black, Hispanic, or Pacific Islander, underscoring TECP's commitment to diversity and inclusion. Additionally, 34% of TECP participants in Denver identify as female, further emphasizing the program's efforts to address gender disparities in the workforce. With 35% of the national tech workforce comprised of non-white workers, and only 27% female, this data highlights TECP's intentional focus on historically marginalized communities and its dedication to fostering equitable opportunities for all participants.

TECP serves as an invaluable resource for the community by offering expertise, networking opportunities, funding support, best practices, data and analytics, technical assistance, and community engagement to address local workforce development challenges.

Through TECP, Denverites gain access to a network of industry partners, educational institutions, training providers, and government agencies, enabling collaboration and knowledge sharing. Funding opportunities provided by TECP facilitate the implementation of training programs, job placement services, and other workforce development initiatives tailored to community needs. By leveraging TECP's resources, workforce development regions can develop effective workforce development strategies, measure their impact, and engage residents in the design and implementation of initiatives that promote economic opportunity and prosperity for all.
