

- Owner: Waldman Condominium Homeowners Association
 — Owner gives consent to designation
- Structure meets criteria: Architecture 2B and Geography 3A
- Application is complete
- August 16, 2011 LPC voted to move the application to a public hearing
- September 20, 2011 LPC moved that the designation be moved forward to City Council with a recommendation of approval

LPC

- -CPD received designation application July 21, 2011
- -RNOs received notice of application August 8, 2011
- -LPC moved application to public hearing at their meeting on August 16, 2011

LPC Public Hearing

- -All RNOs within 200 feet notified of Public hearing August 16, 2011
- -All owner's of record notified of public hearing August 18, 2011
- -LPC Public Hearing September 20, 2011

LUTI

- All RNOs within 200 feet notified of LUTI meeting September 23, 2011
- -LUTI reviewed the application October 4, 2011

-Mayor Council

- -All RNO's within 200 feet notified of Mayor Council October 5, 2011
- -Mayor Council reviewed the application October 11, 2011

City Council First Reading

- -All RNOs within 200 feet notified of CC First Reading on October 11, 2011
- -City Council First Reading October 17, 2011
