1	Section 1. That Chapter 14, Article V of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by							
2	deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

4	(a) Full-time magistrates. Beginning January 1, 2024, eEach full time county court							
5	magistrate shall be paid a salary equal to a compa-ratio of 0.947 of the pay grade applicable to the job							
6	classification entitled "Assistant City Attorney—Section Supervisor" in the then current classification							
7	and pay plan adopted and maintained in accordance with chapter 18, division 2 of article II.							
8	(b) Part-time magistrates. Beginning January 1, 2024, eEach part time county court							
9	magistrate shall be paid an hourly rate equal to a compa-ratio of 0.947 of the pay grade applicable to							
20	the job classification entitled "Assistant City Attorney—Section Supervisor" in the current classification							
21	and pay plan adopted and maintained in accordance with chapter 18, division 2 of article II.							
22	(c) On-call magistrates. Each on-call part time county court magistrate shall be paid an							
23	hourly rate equal to a compa-ratio of 0.947 of the pay grade applicable to the job classification entitled							
24	"Assistant City Attorney—Section Supervisor" in the current classification and pay plan adopted and							
25	maintained in accordance with chapter 18, division 2 of article II.							
26	(ed) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (e), full time and part time county court							
27	magistrates shall receive benefits paid to or on behalf of employees by the city, in an amount not to							
28	exceed the amount established by this chapter for career service employees. In lieu of receiving paid							
29	sick leave and paid vacation leave, full time and part time county court magistrates may receive paid							
80	time off in an amount not to exceed twenty-five (25) days per year, and to carry over from year to year							
31	up to ten (10) days of paid time off each year but shall not be entitled to receive payment for accrued							
32	time off upon termination or retirement from employment with the city. The presiding judge of the							
33	county court shall administer the paid time off program for county court magistrates and may							

promulgate additional rules for the administration of the program.
