The Denver Police Department (DPD) is seeking approval for a capital equipment purchase of two EV SUVs. This purchase is part of an Interagency Agreement between the Office of Climate Action, Sustainability, and Resiliency (CASR) and the DPD for a pilot project that will allow DPD to test using EV technology. These vehicles will be tested in the full range of DPD operations, helping CASR understand the best opportunities for integrating EVs into DPD’s fleet. This funding would come from the Climate Protection Fund (11880) to promote sustainable mobility through a demonstration of EV technology for City operations. This pilot will not guarantee automatic replacement when the vehicles hit their end-of-life cycle. For more information see the attached Executive Summary.
