- Led the redesign of the newspaper in 2004, the first in 20 years.
- Oversaw a sports department widely considered one of the best in the country and a consistent winner of the coveted Triple Crown from the Associated Press Sports Editors.
- Improved the paper's political coverage and established an investigative projects team.

- Directed coverage of the 2008 Democratic National Convention in Denver, at which Barack Obama accepted his party's nomination for president.
- Rebuilt the paper's online news operation, which monthly has more than 6 million unique visitors and 34 million page views, the best in the company.
- Helped The Post achieve a social media audience that is among the top 10 for newspapers
 of any size in the country.
- Created DPTV to increase video inventory and generate revenue. In 2015, The Post had 10 million video plays and published more than 7,000 videos. - In charge of criminal justice coverage when first hired; became city editor in 1987, metro editor in 1989 and supervised local news coverage continuously until 1991, when I became deputy managing editor in charge of the daily paper and later the Sunday paper.
- Involved in nearly every major story at the paper between 1987 and 2002, including a workplace shooting, a major trolley crash, escalating gang violence in the early 1990s and Nelson Mandela's visit to Boston in 1990.
- Supervised coverage of the controversial Charles Stuart murder case, which exposed the tender underbelly of race in Boston.
- Helped direct coverage of the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks, in which two Boston jetliners crashed into the World Trade Center towers.
- Initiated the investigation that uncovered the Catholic pedophile priest scandal, which won The Globe a Pulitzer Prize for Public Service in 2003.
- Key player in diversifying the newsroom, hiring and promoting journalists of color in all departments.
- In charge of developing topical Page One enterprise stories from across departments.

THE PLAIN DEALER, Cleveland, Ohio 1980-1986

- Covered county government and the administration of Mayor George Voinovich (who
 went on to become Ohio governor and a U.S. senator). Became state editor in 1984,
 responsible for all coverage outside of Greater Cleveland and the state legislature.
- Was in charge of the Ohio presidential primary coverage, featuring U.S. Sen. John Glenn as an early contender. Managed people much older and more experienced and learned a lot about leadership.
- Became the city editor in 1984 and handled projects on child sexual abuse and probing explanatory work about the AIDS epidemic.

 Directed major breaking stories, including the public suicide of the city's first black school superintendent, the hijacking of a Cleveland jetliner, the mass murder of four women at a public library by a misogynist and the Challenger shuttle explosion, which killed a New Hampshire school teacher as well as an Akron, Ohio, native.

THE JOURNAL HERALD, Dayton, Ohio 1976-1980

 Did basic weekend and night duty and then was assigned to cover the southern suburbs. Broke stories about police brutality and petty graft. Also wrote about education and criminal justice. At age 23 was assigned to cover Dayton City Hall.
