7 8 9	For an ordinance amending Articles I and III of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver regarding licensing of dogs and cats.					
0	WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to require licensing of dogs and cats because licensing	ng				
1	enables the reunion of missing pets with their owners; reduces crowding in animal shelters; helps to					
2	identify and control stray animals;					
3	WHEREAS, licensing of dogs and cats over the age of six months, and certain vaccinations					
4	have been required since 1995 but it is estimated that less than 10% of Denver pets are currently					
5	licensed and the vaccination rate is unknown;					
6	WHEREAS, repeal of the licensing condition that animals be vaccinated while nevertheless					
7	retaining the requirement for vaccinations will promote the public interest in licensed pets while					
8	maintaining protection of public health and welfare.					
9	WHEREAS, expanded opportunities to apply for and receive licenses will enhance compliance					
20	with the licensing requirements of the city and provide additional information for the Department'					
21	follow-up with pet owners regarding compliance with vaccination requirements.					
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:					
23	Section 1. That a new section 8-6 of Article I of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal Coo	эb				
24	shall be adopted by adding the language underlined as follows:					
25	"Sec. 8-6. Unlawful to give false information.					
26	It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to make, convey or cause to be imparted					
27	or conveyed, false statements in applications or to furnish, present or exhibit any					
28	fictitious or false documentation pursuant to this chapter."					
29	Section 2. That Section 8-63 of Article III of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal Code sh	all				
30	be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined as follows:					
31	"Sec. 8-63. License; issuance.					
32	(a) Licenses may be applied for in person, by mail, or online by the owner of a dog or					
33	cat or owner's representative. Upon filing of the completed application, either					

online, in person, or by mail, and payment of the license fee, necessary fees, and
after receipt of satisfactory proof of rabies immunization, the manager or person
lawfully designated and authorized to issue licenses on the manager's behalf shall
issue to the applicant a one-year license to the applicant for the current year for a
one-year license and or a three-year license for the current and two subsequent
years for a three-year license provided, however, that three year licenses shall only
be issued for dogs and cats with a valid three years rabies vaccination. Licensed
veterinarians may be designated to issue licenses upon receipt of a properly
completed application and fee, or they may and submit applications for licenses on
behalf of their clients, and as provided by the board of environmental health $\underline{\cdot}$, \underline{t} The
manager may nominally compensate veterinarians for submitting processing
licenses

- (b) The license tag shall be attached to the each licensed dog or cat at all times when it is off the property of the owner by means of a collar or harness, and it shall be unlawful to place this tag on any dog or cat animal other than the dog or cat for which the license was issuedpurchased.
- (c) The license tag shall be attached to each licensed cat at all times when it is off the property of the owner by means of a collar or harness unless the cat bears an identifiable microchip, and it shall be unlawful to place this tag on any animal other than the cat for which the license was issued."

Section 3. That Section 8-63 of Article III of Chapter 8 of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined as follows:

"Sec. 8-64. Rabies vaccination <u>certification</u> requirement.

Licenses shall not be issued for any dog or cat unless satisfactory proof of rabies vaccination is presented to the manager, unless such person presents to the manager a written statement from a licensed Colorado veterinarian that vaccination for rabies would be detrimental to the health of the specific dog or cat. The owner shall certify on the license application that the dog or cat has been vaccinated for rabies as required in division 2 of this Article II or agree to provide proof of vaccination within thirty (30) days following issuance of the license."
