A BILL

For an Ordinance approving the proposed donation and transfer of ownership and responsibility of three twenty-four foot medical surge supply trailers from the Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security to Denver Health & Hospital Authority (DHHA), Rural Metro Fire, and Englewood Fire Department.

WHEREAS, The Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security (OEMHS), in consultation with Denver Health and Hospital Authority (DHHA), desires to transfer ownership and responsibility of three twenty-four foot supply trailers to DHHA, Rural Metro Fire, and Englewood Fire Department, which originally were purchased by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) for regional medical response in 2006, and have been granted to, owned and maintained by OEMHS.

WHEREAS, recent changes to Denver metro area medical response plans have led to a consensus among regional emergency management, medical, and public health agencies that dispersal of these trailers throughout the metro area is better aligned with current medical response strategies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. The proposed donation and transfer of ownership and responsibility of three twenty-four foot grant-funded medical surge trailers to Denver Health & Hospital Authority, Rural Metro Fire and Englewood Fire Department is hereby approved.
