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### Finance & Services

BR15- Approves a \$2.5 million contract with Triple C Communications, Inc. 0061 through 1-22-20 to provide radio portables and mobiles for Public Works and other non-safety agencies (RADIOP25\_800MHZ0819A).

BR15- Changes the Special Revenue Fund (SRF) for the child care facility 0063 inspection program so that the SRF is appropriated for the annual contract amount rather than set up on a cash basis.

BR15- Amends a print services contract with Lewan and Associates solely to 0074 add a pricing section for printer accessories that are leased by the contractor (201416395-01).

BR15- Grants a permanent easement to the Regional Transportation District 0079 (RTD) for improvements associated with the RTD-owned parking garage at 11th Avenue and Sheridan Blvd. in Council District 3 (FINAN-201419704-00).

BR15- Approves the City Council 2014 year-end budget reconciliation by 0104 transferring \$148,131 of City Council budget savings to City Council Special Revenue Funds, transferring \$35,781 of City Council budget savings to other City funds for various projects, transferring \$1,500 from the Council District 2 Special Revenue Fund to the Police Donations Fund for tactical equipment purchases, and giving back \$22,558 of City Council budget savings to the City's General Fund.

Tejon Street in Council District 9.

RR15- Approves the subdivision plat for Green Valley Ranch Filing No. 69  
0060 located at the southeast corner of Tower Road and 51st Avenue in  
Council District 11.

BR15- Adds \$883,587 (for a new total of \$2,296,363.45) to the contract with  
0062 Wilson & Company, Inc. for additional design services, construction  
related services, land acquisition services, and site investigation on the  
33rd Street Outfall Project (31st and 36th Street Outfall Project) in  
Council Districts 8 & 9 (201101768).

RR15- Appoints Sarah Wolfgram to the Denver County Cultural Council.

BR15- Relinquishes 4 easements at the Gates Rubber Plant site in Council  
0069 District 7.

BR15- Approves an intergovernmental agreement with Colorado Department of  
0070 Transportation (CDOT) to replace the Evergreen Lake House Road  
Bridge with \$632,000 (80%) in funding from CDOT and \$158,000  
(20%) in local match (201520417).

BR15- Adds \$3 million to the contract with Interlock Construction (for a total  
0071 maximum capacity of \$8 million) for on-call construction services for a  
variety of facility improvement projects (201208982).

BR15- Adds \$3 million to the contract with FCI Construction (for a total  
0072 maximum capacity of \$8 million) for on-call construction services for a  
variety of facility improvement projects (201208984-1).

BR15- Approves a \$1,655,641.32 agreement with ECI Site Construction  
0076 Management, Inc. for the construction of Pasquinel's Landing Park,  
Phase II of the South Platte River Vision project in Council District 7  
(201520277).

BR15- Approves the \$1,915,402 purchase of two Pierce Velocity Pumpers and  
0077 one Pierce Aerial Ladder for the Fire Department from Pierce  
Manufacturing (PWOPS 000011970).

BR15- Approves changes to Southwest YMCA fees ranging in a \$1-\$3 increase  
0081 in most memberships and a \$7 decrease in dual memberships in Council  
District 2.

BR15- Adds \$226,221 and one year to the agreement with Deighton  
0082 Associates, Ltd (for a new total and end date of \$1,291,150 and 12-14-  
15) to support data collection and analysis of pedestrian assets for  
Americans with Disabilities Act compliance and for annual software

support and maintenance fees associated with Denver's Street Asset Management System (CE01113).

RR15- 0073 Dedicates City-owned land as Fox Street near the intersection of Fox Street and West 29th Avenue in Council District 9.
