**A BILL**

**For an ordinance establishing a new Fund in the Capital Improvements and Capital Maintenance Fund Series for the “Climate State Capital Projects” program.**

**WHEREAS**, Colorado House Bill 22-1026 created a tax refund mechanism (“Clean Commute” tax credit) of \$250,000 yearly in 2023 and 2024 for Colorado employers to invest in alternative commute options for their workforce; and

**WHEREAS**, the bill amends C.R.S. 39-22-509 to allow for a local government or nonprofit organization to file a corporate income tax return for information purposes to enable that entity to claim the credits allowed; and

**WHEREAS**, the Office of Climate Action, Sustainability, and Resiliency (CASR) actively invests in programs and services that provide affordable, clean, safe, and reliable transportation choices that are eligible for the Clean Commute tax credit; and

**WHEREAS**, a companion ordinance request to create the “Climate State Revenue” Operating Special Revenue Fund (SRF) has been submitted via Ordinance 1139, Series of 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, the City requires a new Capital Project Fund to receive transfers from the “Climate State Revenue SRF” for climate-related capital projects;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

**Section 1.** A new Fund is hereby established in the Capital Improvements and Capital Maintenance Fund Series, Accounting No. 31000, for “Climate State Capital Projects”, Accounting No. 34806, for the purpose of accounting for various climate-related capital projects.

**Section 2.** Monies received from transfers from the “Climate State Revenue” Special Revenue Fund shall be deposited into the Treasury of the City and credited to Fund No. 34806, which is set forth and described in Section 20-18 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver.


1       **Section 3.** Expenditures are hereby authorized for the “Climate Federal Capital Projects” Fund,  
2 Accounting No. 34806, to be expended by the Executive Director of the Office of Climate Action,  
3 Sustainability and Resiliency. Authorized expenditures for Accounting No. 34806 include capital  
4 improvements, such as sustainable transportation, building electrification, energy efficiency, solar,  
5 battery storage, and electric vehicle charging infrastructure.

6       **Section 4.** The Chief Financial Officer of the City and County of Denver is hereby authorized  
7 and directed to make such book and record entries and to do such other things as may be  
8 necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.
