  - a. Scope of Work

The proposed ordinance will utilize a portion of the City's Private Activity Bond Volume Cap Allocation for the purpose of financing multifamily housing by September 2014. The State of Colorado's Department of Local Affairs has awarded more than sufficient Private Activity Volume Cap Allocation to the City for this purpose. This ordinance allows for the use of \$18,000,000 of Private Activity Bond allocation to be utilized in 2014, consistent with Colorado statutes and the Internal Revenue Code. The affordability election related to Private Activity Bonds will be 40% of the units at 60% Area Median Income (AMI), but the property will consist of approximately 156 affordable rental units serving households at 50% and 60% AMI.
