EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Business Improvement Districts (BID's) are organized for the benefit of commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and their maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities. The operating plan and budget for Cherry Creek North Business Improvement District (the "District") is submitted annually.

General Description of District and Location: The District is located just southeast of central downtown Denver and covers a 16-block area. The District boundaries generally are University Boulevard on the west, Steele Street on the east, between 1st and 3rd Avenues.

The District encompasses a mixed-use area including retail, office and residential development that was originally created to fund and maintain streetscape improvements installed in 1989. Since then, the District has experienced significant growth prompting it to implement a Capital Improvement Plan to revitalize the area. Improvements constructed in 2010-2011 totaled \$18.5M and included: improvements to Fillmore Plaza, streetscape enhancements, lighting, signage and directories. The District issued bonds to finance this work and through the years has advance-refunded the original bonds to take advantage of interest rate and maturity savings. As of year-end 2024, the District expects to have \$8,610,000 in principal debt outstanding.

The District also provides services such as:

- Maintenance
- Marketing & advertising of district events & programs
- Security for businesses & public areas within the District
- Snow & trash collection.

Operations, improvements, and debt service of the BID are financed by a mill levy assessed only on taxable commercial real property within the District. Additionally, the District has authorized a 1% Lodging Fee to be paid by hotels within the District's boundaries. The District plans to assess a 17.642 total mill levy during 2025. Additionally, the District anticipates collecting \$600,000 in Lodging Fees in 2025. The total budgeted expenditures and reserve allocations for 2025 are \$10,493,489. The 2024 amended budget includes increased revenue, resulting in total revenues of \$9,965,693 versus original revenues of \$9,108,532; the 2024 amended budget includes budgetary expenditures of \$9,593,633 versus original budgeted expenditures of \$9,069,330.

District Structure: The Board of Directors oversees the operations of the District. These duties include annually recommending the mill levy to be imposed to support operational activities, a work plan, and a budget. The District has a 13-member Board of Directors which is currently composed of 10 electors with 3 vacant seats.

For all BIDs that have mill levies: City Council will pass a resolution in December to levy all special district mill levies for the 2025 budget year.
