Background:

Since November of 2006, the City acting through the Division of Small of Business Opportunity, Office of Economic Development has administered a Minority Business Enterprise/Women Business Enterprise (MWBE) program. This is a program of nondiscrimination in city contracts for construction, reconstruction and remodeling and professional design and construction services. The program is designed to prevent discrimination against businesses that have been certified as minority business enterprises (MBEs) and/or women business enterprises (WBEs). A disparity study for this program was conducted in May 2006 to narrowly tailor the MWBE program as required by relevant decisions in the US Supreme Court, Circuit Court of Appeals and District Courts.

The proposed contract will update the 2006 Disparity Study as well as provide recommendations to improve the effectiveness of the program and help ensure the program's legal compliance with regards to annual and specific project goal setting, certification processes, and other regulatory compliance issues. This contract also includes a study to examine and compare the historical utilization of Certified and Registered apprentices used in publicly funded projects versus private industry projects. This information will potentially inform a City implemented apprenticeship utilization program
