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Sec. 18-101. Deputy sheriff major, deputy sheriff division chief, and undersheriff pay plans.

(a) The annual salaries paid to deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the undersheriff during 2013 and 2014 shall be as shown in the following table:

Deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the undersheriff shall serve one (1) year at each step. Each shall move to the next step in his or her respective rank on the anniversary date or promotional date; provided, however, that if the anniversary date or promotional date is on a day other than the first day of a payroll period, the employee shall move to the next highest step on the first day of the first payroll period after his or her anniversary date or promotional date.

(a) The annual salary range for deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs and the sheriff shall be as follows:

Deputy sheriff major: \$96,772 - \$128,705

Deputy sheriff division chief: \$109,986 - \$149,860

Sheriff: \$128,201 - \$171,539

(b) Promotions. When a deputy sheriff major or deputy sheriff division chief promotes from one (1) rank to another, the deputy sheriff major or deputy sheriff division chief shall be placed at the closest step in the higher rank that results in at least a nine and one half (9.5) percent increase above the base salary received prior to promotion.

Section 2. That effective January 1, 2015, Chapter 18, Article IV, Section 18-114 of the Revised Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18-114. Acting pay.

Effective January 1, 2014 2015, a deputy sheriff division chief who, for a period of eight (8) consecutive work hours or more, is temporarily assigned to act as the undersheriff shall be compensated at the rate of pay of the undersheriff, in lieu of the salary of deputy sheriff division chief, for such time assigned to act as the undersheriff; and, a deputy sheriff major who, for a period of eight (8) consecutive work hours or more, is temporarily assigned to act as a deputy sheriff division chief shall be compensated at the pay rate of deputy sheriff division chief, in lieu of the salary of deputy sheriff major, for such time assigned to act as a deputy sheriff division chief. In either such case, the applicable pay rate in the higher rank shall be at the closest step in the higher rank that results in at least (1) a nine and one-half percent (9.5%) percent increase above the individual's existing pay rate as a deputy sheriff division chief or deputy sheriff major, or (2) the salary range minimum for the higher rank, whichever is greater.
