CCH and Mental Health Center of Denver are the only two providers licensed in Denver to provide th service. Each ACT slot has an average cost of \$12,000 per person. Persons average 18 months in treatment before become stable. Clients receiving ACT services show a marked reduction in new arrests as well as reduction in detox, emergency a hospital stays. Services to be delivered include day to-day treatment with the emphasis on treatment plan compliance, coordination with the Court to Community team and cases receiving court oversight.	ning
