# Contract Extension: Out of School Youth Services

- **Program Administrator:** Ability Connection Colorado
- **Current Term:** 07/01/21 – 06/30/22
- **Extension Request:** 06/30/22 - 08/31/22
- **Amount:** \$550,000 (\$0 added)
- **Service:**

*For the past three years, Ability Connection Colorado has provided Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act services for out-of-school youth on behalf of Denver Workforce Services. This has included customized employment and training services for eligible youth ages 16-24. This two-month extension will allow for additional time to transition customers to the current provider, Eckerd Connects without adding any additional dollars to the contract.*

- Program Administrator: Eckerd Connects
- Term: 07/01/2021 – 06/30/2023
- Amount: \$4,520,070
- Service:

*Eckerd Connects will serve as both the one-stop operator and service provider, that employs vision, innovation, accountability, and efficient and effective utilization of resources in workforce development programming. As customers are engaged across multiple entry points, their individual needs shall be identified and addressed, and they will be provided with access to programs, services, and navigation to supplementary supports.*
