**a. Scope of Work**

ACP DIA 1287 INVESTORS, LLC (ACP) desires access to DIA property to develop a north-south, at-grade, roadway consisting of a minimum of two 12-foot wide paved lanes to extend Jackson Gap Street south from its current point of curvature to the east near the 72nd Ave. ACP will fund construction of the Jackson Gap Extension, at no expense to DIA and/or The City and County of Denver. This road extension will provide mutual benefits to DIA and ACP, including reducing the number of vehicles traveling on segments of Peña Boulevard, providing a second significant entry point to DIA, aiding emergency vehicle response, and facilitating regional access to DIA.
