a. Scope of Work

This Ordinance will authorize the appropriation of the 2nd allocation for the 2011 funding of the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) authorized by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Awarded annually, the Emergency Solutions Grant has provided a stable source of funds to help meet emergency services needed to address the amelioration of poverty. The grant program operates on a fiscal year beginning January 1st. For FY 2011, Denver Human Services has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$389,480. Based on the Letter of Intent, Human Services expects to receive an additional \$219,083 from a second allocation that is authorized by HUD. The official grant award letter is not expected to be received until January 2012.
