5 **A BILL**

6 **For an ordinance amending Section 15-11 (Initiative and referendum petitions)**
7 **of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver to modify the**
8 **timeframe for the review and determination of sufficiency for initiative,**
9 **referendum, and recall petitions during an election and to modify the section**
10 **heading.**

11 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

12 **Section 1.** Section 15-11 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver
13 shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as
14 follows:

15 **~~Sec. 15-11. - Initiative and referendum petitions~~ Initiative, referendum and recall petitions;**
16 **Fiscal impact estimate and ballot information booklet.**

17 (a) *Provisions applicable to all initiative, referendum or recall petitions.*

19 (5) *Filing of petitions; determination of sufficiency; protest and hearings.* After
20 signatures have been obtained, the petitioners' committee shall file the
21 completed petition with the clerk and recorder by the close of business on a
22 normal business day. All related petition sections shall be filed at the same time.
23 The clerk and recorder shall record the same and shall hold the petition for a
24 period of twenty-five (25) days, during which time the clerk and recorder shall
25 determine whether the petition is signed by the requisite number of registered
26 electors; except that if the petitioners' committee files a completed petition or an
27 addendum during the time that the clerk and recorder has polling locations open
28 for an election, the twenty-five (25) day period shall commence on the day after
29 the election. In the event the clerk and recorder determines that the petition
30 contains an insufficient number of signatures, the clerk and recorder shall notify
31 the petitioners' committee of the insufficiency, and the petitioners' committee

1 may cure the insufficiency by filing an addendum to the original petition for the
2 purpose of offering such number of additional signatures as will cure the
3 insufficiency. Any addendum shall be filed within the time period allowed for the
4 original petition as provided in this Charter. The clerk and recorder shall record
5 and hold any addendum for an additional period of twenty-five (25) days and
6 verify the signatures on the addendum in the same manner as is provided for
7 the original petition. Within the twenty-five-day period for review of the petition
8 or any addendum thereto, a protest subscribed and sworn to under oath may
9 be filed by a registered elector. A protestor shall identify by name the signers
10 protested against or specify the factual and legal basis of any other alleged
11 defects in the petition. The clerk and recorder shall consider the grounds of
12 protest and may hear evidence, after giving notice of the hearings to the
13 petitioners' committee, the protestors, and others the clerk and recorder may
14 require for the hearings. Hearings shall be concluded and findings issued as
15 soon as practicable but not more than fifty (50) days after the filing of a protest
16 with the clerk and recorder.
