11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:			
12	Section 1. Section 54-362. (Fee.),	of Chapter 54 (Traffic Regulations), Denver Revised		
13	Municipal Code (DRMC) shall be amended by deleting the language stricken below and adding			
14	the language underlined below to read and be read as follows:			
15	Sec. 54-362. Fee.			
16	(a) All parade or special event applic	cations must be submitted with a nonrefundable		
17	application fee for administrative costs of fifty dollars (\$50.00) if the proposed parade or special			
18	event will not exceed fifteen (15) blocks and one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) if the parade			
19	exceeds fifteen (15) blocks. Whenever the mayor has declared an extraordinary event, the			
20	mayor may provide in the declaration for the	e refund of application fees to applicants who are		
21	denied permits for parades for any of the re	asons set forth in section 54-364.		
22	(b) The first fifteen (15) blocks of the	parade route commencing from the starting point as		
23	designated in the application will be policed	by peace officers who shall manage traffic and		
24	crowd activity at no cost to the applicant. Ex	ccept as specified in section 54-362(c) below, if If the		
25	designated route exceeds fifteen blocks as	measured from the starting point, the cost of staffing		
26	the additional parade blocks with peace office	cers shall be paid by the applicant within forty-five		
27	(45) days after the parade has occurred. Th	e cost of the additional parade blocks will be		
28	determined at the standard Denver Police D	epartment on-duty over-time rate and be based on		
29	the additional length and the size of the par	ade.		
30	(c) Any parade which traverses in its	entirety more than fifteen (15) blocks shall pay the		
31	application fee of one hundred and fifty dollar	ars (\$150.00) as specified in section 54-362(a)		
32	above, but shall not be required to pay any additional fees as otherwise required for parades of			
33	over fifteen (15) blocks, as specified in sect	on 54-362(b) above, provided such parade:		

1	i. Has two hundred (200) or fewer partic	<u>zipants;</u>	
2	ii. Has three (3) or fewer motor vehicles	<u>;</u>	
3	iii. Does not, from the very first particip	ant or vehicle to the very	last participant or
4	vehicle, exceed three blocks; and		
5	iv. Requires no more than 10 police off	ers for escort.	
6	(d) If after experience with a specific parade of	or parade organizer the m	nanager of safety
7	determines that the parade's participants have condu	icted themselves in a ma	ınner which has
8	required additional police officers for escort, has not	met the requirements of	54-362(c) or has
9	generated additional costs, the manager may require	the payment of costs as	specified in
10	section 54-362(b) above for parades over 15 blocks.	The applicant shall be re	equired to pay such
11	additional costs before any new parade permits are is	ssued. Failure to comply	<u>with the</u>
12	requirements of the parade permit and this section 54	<u>1-362 may also be groun</u>	ds for denial of
13	future permits.		
14	(e) The entire cost of conducting all special ev	vents with peace officers	, barricades and
15	traffic control devices shall be paid by the applicant. I	f the event is a historical	event with a
16	history of prompt payment, the cost must be paid with	าin ten (10) business day	s after the
17	conclusion of the event. Payment for all other special	events must be made in	ı full ten (10)
18	business days prior to the event date. The cost of co	nducting the event will be	e determined by the
19	command officer in charge of the traffic operations but	ıreau or his designee, ar	nd will be based on
20	the complexity, length and staffing needed for traffic	control.
