Why This Is Happening

- Federal legislation (HR1) introduces major Medicaid and SNAP changes
- Goal: Manage federal spending and reduce fraud, waste and abuse

Key Federal Changes (Medicaid)

- Medicaid renewals done on the individual level rather than household level (Sept. 2026)
- 6-month renewals for expansion population (Dec 2026)
- Work requirements for adults 19–64 (Dec 2026)
- Immigrant eligibility restrictions (Oct 2026)
- Retroactive coverage limits (Dec 2026)

HR1 Medicaid Timeline

2027

- Increased address verification and eligibility checks required
- Ongoing system and workflow changes to support new federal requirements

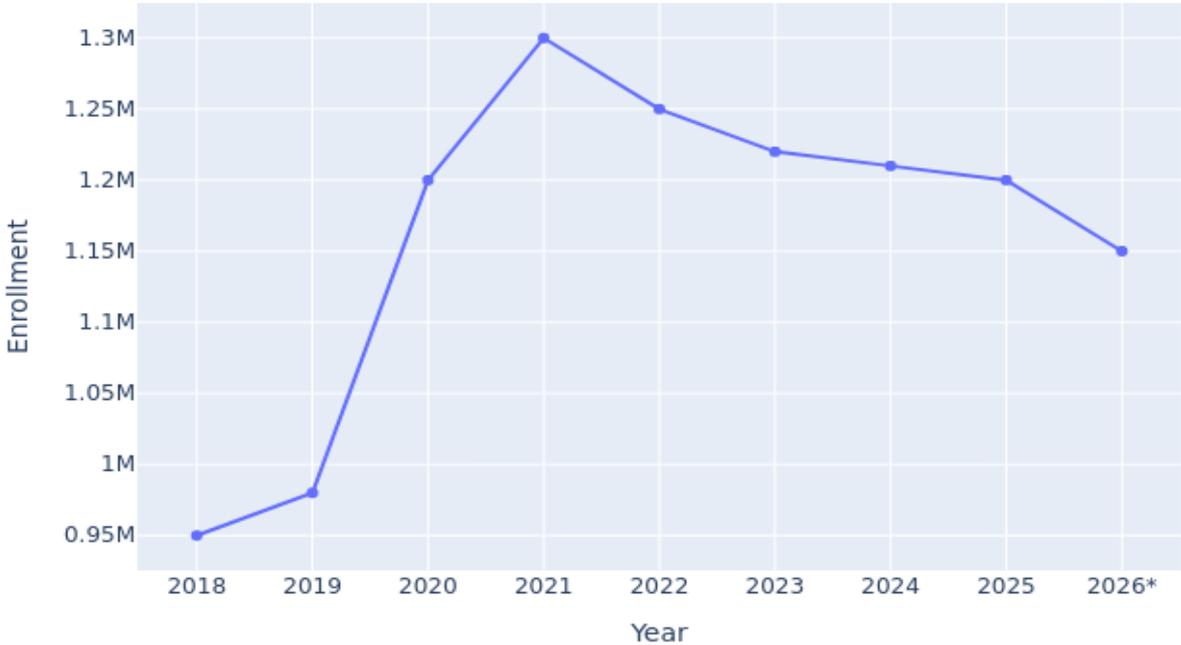
2027-2032 (phased)

- Provider tax reductions phase in over multiple years
- State and local impacts increase gradually as reductions accumulate

Ongoing

- Additional federal guidance and state implementation decisions continue to evolve

Medicaid Enrollment Trend (CO)



Fiscal & Operational Impact

- County workload increase for renewals, verification and new applications (due to churn)
- Pending budget requests: \$17M/year for admin support (SFY26–28)
- Provider tax reductions: \$900M–\$2.5B impact to Medicaid budget by FFY2032

State Preparation

- Staff training; system updates
- Automation planning; workflow adjustments

Coordination & Awareness

- Early conversations with CO Access and HCPF
- Potential collaboration with mayor's office, city council & community partners
