Monies from the disposable bag fee shall be used to defray the costs to the city for administering the disposable bag fee program <u>and related activities</u>, which may include the following specific uses:

That Section 2-428 of Denver Revised Municipal Code is amended by deleting

- a. Administrative costs associated with developing, implementing, and administering the disposable bag fee;
  - b. Costs to Pprovide reusable carryout bags to residents and visitors;
- c. Educate<u>ion for residents</u>, businesses, and visitors about the requirements of the program and impact of disposable bags on the city's environmental health, the importance of reducing the number of disposable plastic bags and other single-use products entering the waste stream, and the expenses associated with mitigating the effects of disposable bags on the city's drainage system, transportation system, wildlife and environment;
- d. Fund p Programs and infrastructure that allow the city to reduce waste associated with disposable bags and other single-use products:
- e. Purchase and install e Equipment designed to minimize bag pollution, including, recycling containers, and waste receptacles associated with disposable bags and other single-use products;
