A BILL

For an ordinance to grant authority from the City Council to Technology Services, Denver Media Services, to increase the Public, Education, and Government Access Fee to \$1.05 per residential subscriber per month, as provided in the cable franchise agreement with Mile High Cable Partners, L.P. (doing business as Comcast)

WHEREAS, via Council Bill No. 13-0975, the City Council approved a ten-year renewal of the cable franchise granted to Mile High Cable Partners, L.P. (doing business as Comcast); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 9.6 of the franchise, Comcast is required to charge each residential subscriber a PEG Contribution Fee to be used solely for capital costs related to Public, Educational and Governmental Access, as defined in the franchise; and

WHEREAS, the franchise allows the PEG Contribution Fee to be increased to \$1.05 per subscriber per month, if so approved by the City Council acting by ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. In accordance with Section 9.6 of the cable franchise granted by the City and County of Denver to Mile High Cable Partners, L.P. (doing business as Comcast), the PEG Contribution Fee shall be increased to \$1.05 per residential subscriber per month, with notice of the fee increase to be delivered by Technology Services, Denver Media Services to Comcast immediately.
