Executive Summary

Background

In 2006 City Council passed Ordinance No. 760, which enabled the Minority Women and Business Enterprise (MWBE) and Small Business Enterprise (SBE) programs. Ordinance No. 760 authorizes specific activities the Division of Small Business Opportunity may perform to prevent discrimination, provide small business outreach and small business development services in the areas of construction, reconstruction and remodeling, and professional design and construction services. The enabling ordinance will expire on June 30, 2013. The City has determined that the conditions originally justifying the enactment of the MBE/WBE and SBE programs still exist and that it is in the best interests of the City to extend the ordinance.

A 6 month extension of the ordinance will allow for additional time to analyze the findings of the most recent disparity study, and conduct an administrative review to identify potential adjustment(s) to the existing programs.

Proposed Amendment Language

SECTION 1. That Subsection (b) of Section 28-83, D.R.M.C. will be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined to read as follows:

Sec. 28-83. Review and sunset.
