Attach executive summary if more space needed:  DHS requests authorization to approve a first amendment to the contract with the Smith Agency to add \$332,326 and a reduction of the contract's end date, which will now conclude on 09/30/2026. The purpose of these changes is to ensure the continued services of out-of-home placement services for unaccompanied refugee minor children/youth ages birth to 18 (or up to age 21 if placed in the custody of DHS prior to their 18th birthday). This contract uses alternative funding sources to support out-of-home placement services where State Paid funding is not available. This contract is funded through a grant agreement from Unaccompanied Refugee Minor Program (URM/URMP) through a collaborative partnership between the Colorado Refugee Services Program and the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment - Office of Economic Security. The URM program aims to provide culturally and linguistically appropriate foster care and independent living placements for eligible refugee minors in the United States. The primary objectives of the URM program are to reunite these youth with their families or relatives and to provide programming that promotes their social, cultural, and economic integration.
