## Executive Summary Santa Fe BID Creation Ordinance

Business Improvements Districts (BID's) are organized for the benefit of taxable commercial properties to assist with infrastructure improvements and their maintenance, as well as having the ability to perform marketing and economic development activities.

The Santa Fe BID is a business improvement district organized pursuant to the Business Improvement District Act, Section 31-25-1201 *et seq.*, Colorado Revised Statutes. The main purpose of the BID is to improve the economic vitality and overall commercial appeal extending 7 blocks made up of 130 properties located along both sides of Santa Fe Drive from 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

The Santa Fe BID will be a taxable commercial real property owner funded district that provides the following services and improvements: economic development services, physical improvements, safety, enhanced maintenance, and advocacy on behalf of corridor property and businesses.

The estimated 2015 budget is anticipated to be approximately \$100,000. The budget is expected to be funded primarily through assessments applied against the taxable commercial real property within the BID.

The Board of Directors of the District (the "Board") shall consist of seven (7) electors of the District, appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by City Council resolution. The initial members of the Board are proposed as follows: Jack Pappalardo, Debbie Stoner, Andrea Barela, Lindi Sinton, Cheryl Spector, Howard Snyder, Rusty Brown.
