A BILL

For an ordinance repealing ordinance 1841, series of 2024, and reauthorizing a capital equipment purchase from the Public Health Federal Grant Special Revenue Fund.

WHEREAS, ordinance 1841, series of 2024 authorized the Department of Public Health and Environment (DDPHE) to purchase a vehicle to support the Road to Recovery program funded from the "Criminal Justice Early Intervention Grant" program, which was approved via resolution 951, Series of 2024; and

WHEREAS, said purchase was authorized from the DDPHE "Criminal Justice Early Intervention" Grant program budget (14003-6500000); and

WHEREAS, the correct fund for the purchase of the vehicle is the Public Health Federal Grant Fund (14001-6500000);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Ordinance 1841, series of 2024 is hereby repealed.

Section 2. From the Public Health Federal Grant Fund, Accounting No. 14001, the Executive Director of the Denver Department of Health Environment, or duly authorized representatives, is hereby authorized to purchase or acquire the following capital equipment:
